

WAC 182-530-8000 Reimbursement method—Actual acquisition cost (AAC). The medicaid agency uses the following sources to determine actual acquisition cost (AAC) including, but not limited to:

- (1) National average drug acquisition cost (NADAC) published by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS);
- (2) Acquisition cost data made available to the agency by:
 - (a) Audit results from federal or state agencies;
 - (b) Other state health care purchasing organizations;
 - (c) Pharmacy benefit managers;
 - (d) Individual pharmacy providers participating in the agency's programs;
 - (e) Other third-party payers;
 - (f) Drug file databases; and
 - (g) Actuaries or other consultants.
