L&I has calculated the adjusted minimum wage rate for 2024 to \$16.28 per hour, effective January 1, 2024. This is a \$.54 hour increase from 2023.

Calculations for the Executive, Administrative, and Professional (EAP) Exemption Salary Threshold Calculations for 2024

The department of labor and industries recently updated the rule for overtime exemptions for executive, administrative, professional (EAP) workers, including outside sales and computer professionals. To be exempt from overtime, EAP workers must be salaried, paid a minimum specified salary level, and must primarily perform executive, administrative, professional, outside sales or computer professional duties as defined under chapter 296-128 WAC.

According to WAC 296-128-545, the salary thresholds for the EAP overtime exemption are calculated using a multiplier of the minimum wage for a 40-hour workweek and incrementally adjust through 2028. In 2028, the salary threshold will be 2.5 minimum wage for all employers.

Using the 2024 Washington minimum wage of \$16.28, the 2024 salary thresholds for EAP overtime exemption are as follows:

- For small employers with 50 or fewer employees, the applicable EAP salary threshold in 2024 is \$1,302.40 per week (\$67,724.80 annually), which is two times the minimum wage.
- For large employers with 51 or more employees, the applicable EAP salary threshold in 2024 is \$1,302.40 per week (\$67,724.80 annually), which is two times the minimum wage.
- For computer professionals at a small employer with 50 or fewer employees, the applicable wage rate for an exempt computer professional in 2024 is \$56.98 per hour, which is 3.5 times the minimum wage.
- For computer professionals at a large employer with 51 or more employees, the applicable wage rate for an exempt computer professional in 2024 is \$56.98 per hour, which is 3.5 times the minimum wage.

Announcing the Draft Vessel Deconstruction General Permit and Fact Sheet for Review and Comment

The Washington state department of ecology (ecology) proposes to reissue the vessel deconstruction National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) and state waste discharge general permit (permit). The current permit was last issued in November 2019 and is scheduled to expire in **December 2024**. The revised draft permit and fact sheet, which explains the legal and technical basis for the permit, are available with any associated documents for review and public comment from October 18, 2023, through December 6, 2023, 11:59 p.m. Ecology will host informational workshops and public hearings on the draft permit.

Purpose of the Permit: The permit provides statewide NPDES coverage for the deconstruction of vessels over water, including deconstruction activities that occur on a drydock, barge, or pier. The permit does not provide coverage to facilities that are covered under the boatyard general permit or an individual permit that allows this activity. Vessel deconstruction does not include disturbances incidental to vessel retrieval.

The proposed vessel deconstruction general permit limits the discharge of pollutants associated with vessel deconstruction activities to surface waters under the authority of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1251) and limits the discharge of pollutants to surface and groundwater under the authority of the State Water Pollution Control Act (chapter 90.48 RCW).

Applying for Coverage Under the Permit: All facilities may obtain coverage under the permit by submitting a complete permit application to ecology and satisfying all applicable public notice and State Environmental Policy Act requirements (WAC 173-226-200). Access to the application is available online at https://ecology.wa.gov/ vesseldeconstruction.
