## Announcing the Reissuance of the Vessel Deconstruction General Permit

The Washington state department of ecology (ecology) is reissuing the Vessel Deconstruction Stormwater National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) and state waste discharge general permit (permit) on June 20, 2024. The permit becomes effective on August 1, 2024, and expires on July 31, 2029.

Purpose of the Permit: The permit addresses various legal requirements and responsibilities, as well as regulates the discharge of pollutants to protect water quality in Washington state. The permit authorizes the discharge of stormwater and authorized non-stormwater associated with a vessel deconstruction activity. The permit is a combined NPDES and state waste discharge permit that limits the discharge of pollutants to surface waters under the authority of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C 1251) and limits the discharge of pollutants to surface and groundwater under the authority of the State Water Pollution Control Act (chapter 90.48 RCW).

Public Notice Process and Comments: Ecology accepted public comments on the draft permit from October 18, 2023, through December 6, 2023. Ecology held informational public workshops and hearings during this time via online statewide webinars on November 28, 2023, and November 29, 2023. Ecology received written public comments and emails. The comments and ecology's responses are included as Appendix C of the fact sheet.

## Announcing the Reissuance of the Municipal Stormwater General Permits

The Washington state department of ecology (ecology) is reissuing the municipal stormwater general permits (permits) on Monday, July 1, 2024. The permits become effective on August 1, 2024, and expire on July 31, 2029.

Purpose of the Permits: The permits address various legal requirements and responsibilities, and regulate the discharge of pollutants to protect water quality in Washington state. The municipal stormwater general permits provide coverage for municipalities and secondary permittees to develop and implement a stormwater management program to control stormwater runoff into and from their municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4). The permits are a combined national pollutant discharge elimination system and state waste discharge permit that limits the discharge of pollutants to surface waters under the authority of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1251) and limits the discharge of pollutants to surface and groundwater under the authority of the State Water Pollution Control Act (chapter 90.48 RCW).

Public Notice Process and Comments: Ecology accepted public comments on the draft permit from August 16, 2023, through November 10, 2023. Ecology held informational public workshops and hearings during this time via online statewide webinars on September 18, 2023, and November 6, 2023. We held in-person workshops and hearings on October 3, 2023, in Moses Lake and October 17, 2023, in Lacey. Ecology received written and emailed comments during the public comment period. The comments and ecology's responses are included on the permit web page at www.ecology.wa.gov/MS4.

Applying for Coverage Under the Permit: Stormwater management programs to control stormwater runoff into and from their municipal separate storm sewer system covered under the existing permit that reapplied for permit coverage will be covered under the new permit. New or unpermitted drainage systems from municipal stormwater systems may obtain coverage under the permit by submitting a complete permit application to ecology and satisfying all applicable public notice and State Environmental Policy Act requirements (WAC 173-226-200). ## Announcing the safer products for Washington report to the Legislature on Regulatory Determinations for Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) in Priority Consumer Products

This notifies the public that the Washington state department of ecology (ecology), together with the department of health, published the safer products for Washington Cycle 1.5 Regulatory Determinations Report to the legislature on May 30, 2024. This report contains regulatory determinations for firefighting personal protective equipment (PPE) and other products recommended in the 2021 PFAS chemical action plan (CAP).

Regulatory determinations can include restrictions on PFAS in priority products, requirements for manufacturers to report the use of PFAS in priority products to ecology, or no action. We have made the following regulatory determinations for PFAS in priority products:

- Apparel and gear:
  - Reporting requirement for outdoor apparel designed for experts or professionals who are exposed to extreme weather for extended periods of time.
  - o Reporting requirement for shoes.
  - o Reporting requirement for gear.
  - o Restriction for all other types of apparel.
- Firefighting PPE: Reporting requirement.
- Cleaning products: Restriction.
- Automotive washes: Restriction.
- Automotive waxes: Reporting requirement.
- Floor waxes: Reporting requirement.
- Ski waxes: Reporting requirement.
- Hard surface sealants: Reporting requirement.

Rule-making process: To implement these regulatory determinations, ecology will use a rule-making process in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act. Ecology will amend chapter 173-337 WAC, Safer products restrictions and reporting. This rule aims to reduce toxic chemicals in consumer products. Ecology will host webinars on July 30 and August 14, 2024, to answer questions about the regulatory determinations and hear initial suggestions as we develop preliminary rules.

**Project background:** In 2019, the Washington state legislature directed ecology to implement a regulatory program to reduce toxic chemicals in consumer products under chapter 70A.350 RCW. The implementation program is called safer products for Washington. The law requires ecology, in consultation with Washington department of health, to determine regulatory actions that will increase transparency and reduce the use of priority chemicals in priority consumer products.

In 2022, the Washington state legislature amended chapter 70A.350 RCW to require ecology to make regulatory determinations on additional

products containing PFAS as part of our work under the safer products for Washington implementation program. The amended law allows ecology to consider firefighting PPE and products identified in the 2021 PFAS CAP as priority products without taking the actions outlined in RCW 70A.350.030. We are required to make an initial set of regulatory determinations on these products by June 2024 and adopt rules by December 2025. As this work falls between the due dates for our first two review cycles, we are referring to this new review as "Cycle 1.5."

## Announcing the safer products for Washington report to the Legislature on Designation of Priority Chemicals

This notifies the public that the Washington state department of ecology (ecology) and the Washington state department of health (health) have designated priority chemicals and chemical classes for potential regulation in consumer products under the safer products for Washington program.

Ecology began the second cycle of safer products for Washington by releasing a draft version of our report that identifies chemicals or chemical classes of concern in June of 2023. After reviewing feedback from the public and interested parties, we finalized our designation of priority chemicals and chemical classes and published the final report on May 30, 2024.

Priority chemicals and chemical classes for the second cycle of safer products for Washington are:

- Lead and lead compounds.
- Cadmium and cadmium compounds.
- Organobromine and/or organochlorine substances.
- Benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, and xylene substances.
- Formaldehyde and formaldehyde releasers.
- Cyclic volatile methylsiloxanes.
- N-(1,3-dimethylbutyl)-N'-phenyl-p-phenylenediamine (6PPD).

Chemicals within these classes are associated with human and environmental health impacts. Many harm sensitive populations, such as children, and sensitive species, such as salmon. **Project background:** The toxic pollution law (chapter 70A.350 RCW) creates a way to keep harmful chemicals out of the environment. Our program that implements the law is called safer products for Washington.

The law authorizes us to regulate classes of chemicals in consumer products.

The law established a process for ecology to:

- Designate priority chemicals.
- Identify consumer products that contain these chemicals.
- Determine needed regulatory actions, including whether to regulate those chemical-product combinations by requiring reporting or chemical restrictions.
- Adopt rules to implement those regulatory actions.

Chemical restrictions require that safer alternatives are feasible and available. Each of these steps involve stakeholder consultation and legislative reporting.

Current phase of safer products for Washington: We are currently in phase 1 of our second cycle, which starts by identifying chemicals and chemical classes of concern. We will now work with the public and interested parties to identify consumer products that are significant sources or uses of these priority chemicals.
