**Rules Development Agenda
January - July 2025**

The Administrative Procedure Act requires state agencies to prepare a biannual rules development agenda that includes the issues under consideration for rule making for the upcoming six-month period (RCW 34.05.314). Agendas are published in the State Register at the end of January and July each year. Staff proposes the following rule-making agenda for the period from January through July 2025:

Updating enforcement penalty schedules: The public disclosure commission (commission) initiated rule making in 2024 to consider amending the penalty schedules for both brief enforcement hearings (WAC 390-37-143) and full adjudicatory proceedings (WAC 390-37-182). The assessment will include the specified ranges for each category of violation. The commission will consider the factors used to determine mitigating and aggravating circumstances, which are used to determine the appropriate penalty, and whether such factors should be extended to apply to consideration of alternative case resolutions (i.e., warnings, etc.).

Preparation for implementation of SSB 5857 (reorganization of the campaign finance chapter): The legislature enacted SSB 5857 in 2024, which will reorganize the campaign finance law, chapter 42.17A RCW, into a new statutory title. The reorganization does not make any substantive changes to the current law, but will require all statutory references in rule to be changed to the references in the new title. The bill takes effect in 2026, but the commission will begin the process of drafting the new rules to prepare for ultimate adoption.

This notice corrects the contact information only; all other information remains the same as follows.

A certified peer specialist is an individual who has self-identified as in recovery from mental health or behavioral health experiences/challenges and/or is the parent or legal guardian of a person who has applied for, is eligible for, or has received mental health or behavioral health services; has successfully completed HCA's and the department of health's (DOH) required training and testing; and is credentialed by DOH.

Certified peer specialists provide interventions through the use of shared experiences to assist a client in the acquisition and exercise of skills needed to support the client's recovery.

Currently, certified peer counselors working under an agency affiliated registration are limited to providing peer services only in community behavioral health agencies. SPA 25-0001 will allow certified peer specialists and trainees to provide and bill for peer services provided in other settings. Note: Effective January 1, 2027, a person who is registered as an agency-affiliated counselor who engages in the practice of peer support services must hold a certificate as a certified peer specialist or certified peer specialist trainee.

SPA 25-0001 is expected to increase the annual aggregate expenditures/reimbursement/payment for peer services by up to approximately \$267,467.

The department of ecology (ecology) is starting a triennial review of chapter 173-201A WAC, Water quality standards for surface waters of the state of Washington. During this review, we are looking for feedback on our priorities for how we should consider updating the water quality standards over the next three years.

As part of this review, we invite you to comment on our 2025-2027 triennial review draft workplan. This plan outlines our actions from 2025 through 2027 to update the surface water quality standards. We also welcome feedback on any parts of the water quality standards in chapter 173-201A WAC. We are holding an informational webinar and public hearing to talk about our draft plan and listen to your feedback.

What is a triennial review? Section 303 (c)(1) of the federal Clean Water Act (act) requires that we regularly hold public hearings to review state water quality standards. This process is called a triennial review and is intended to ensure that state water quality standards meet the requirements of the act and the needs of the state. The triennial review is not a rule making. Instead, this effort helps inform what rule makings and other actions ecology should consider to keep the water quality standards current with the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) act recommendations and state priorities.

What does chapter 173-201A WAC do? The state's water quality standards, chapter 173-201A WAC, set water quality criteria in lakes, rivers, and marine water to protect beneficial uses, such as swimming and fishing. They also set conditions to protect high-quality water. The water quality standards are implemented through permits and other regulatory mechanisms under the act. They are also used to identify polluted waterbodies and set levels for water cleanup.
