Title or Subject: CHIP State Plan Amendment (SPA) 25-6000 Reentry Targeted Case Management Services for Incarcerated Juveniles.

Effective Date: January 1, 2025.

Description: The federal Consolidated Appropriation Act of 2023 (CAA, 2023) amended section 1902 (a) (84) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396a) to require states to provide screening, diagnostic, and case management services, including referrals, that are available under the children's health insurance program (CHIP) state plan to eligible incarcerated juveniles in the 30 days prior to release. An eligible incarcerated juvenile is one who is determined eligible for CHIP at initial application or renewal who later becomes incarcerated during a continuous eligibility (CE) period. The state may provide CHIP services that are not otherwise covered by the carceral setting to that juvenile through the end of their CE period.

The health care authority (HCA) intends to submit CHIP SPA 25-6000 to provide CHIP services to eligible incarcerated juveniles.

CHIP SPA 25-6000 is expected to increase annual aggregate payment/reimbursement/expenditures for these services by \$44,922.

CHIP SPA 25-6000 is under development. HCA would appreciate any input or concerns regarding this SPA. Title or Subject: Medicaid State Plan Amendment (SPA) 25-0017 Remove Ancillary Services Payments.

Effective Date: August 1, 2025.

Description: The health care authority (HCA) intends to submit SPA 24-0017 to comply with SHB 2051, which removes the requirement for certain health care services to be payable in addition to the daily reimbursement rate (i.e., administrative day rate) paid to hospitals for patients who are in the hospital and do not meet inpatient criteria.

SPA 25-0017 is expected to decrease annual aggregate expenditures by \$1.5 million in state fiscal year 2026 and \$3.1 million in state fiscal year 2027.

The proposed rates, methodologies, and justifications are as follows:

Proposed Rate	Proposed Methodology	Justification
\$0	No reimbursement for ancillary services, other than pharmaceuticals, provided during an administrative day stay.	To comply with Washington state SHB 2051. Washington state administrative days payment policy covers more services than medicare; therefore, the comparison to medicare rates exceeds 100 percent; The reduction in annual expenditures for hospital services is less than the statutory four percent of aggregate fee for service hospital expenditures.

July 1 - December 31, 2025****DIVISION OF BANKS**

Updates to the bank/trust related WAC, chapter 208-512 through 208-598 WAC. The division of banks (division) plans to begin the process to propose amendments to the banking and trust related WAC to ensure the WAC correspond properly to the updated RCW (the splitting of Title 30 RCW into Titles 30A and 30B RCW) and incorporate updates similar to federal laws and guidance. These WAC have not been updated in several years and some areas need correction, clearer language, and modernization. These changes will provide applicants, banks, and trust companies clarity and provide more comprehensive guidance to complement the RCW and the division's practices.

DIVISION OF CONSUMER SERVICES

Check Cashers and Sellers Act. Begin, finalize, and adopt rules under chapter 208-660 WAC to clarify the requirements related to data security and notification of security events, and to make technical or other changes as may be required by changes to state or federal law.

Consumer Loan Act. Finalize and adopt the rule makings related to the Predatory Loan Prevention Act (SSB 6025) and home equity sharing agreements. The preproposal statement of inquiry for both rule makings were filed on March 10, 2025. Begin, finalize, and adopt rules under chapter 208-620 WAC to clarify the requirements related to advertising, permissible fees, and data security and notification of security events. Further, make technical or other changes as may be required by changes to state or federal law.

Escrow Agent Registration Act. Begin, finalize, and adopt rules under chapter 208-680 WAC to clarify the requirements related to contract collection activity and data security and notification of security events. Also, make technical or other changes as may be required by changes to state or federal law.

Mortgage Broker Practices Act. Begin, finalize, and adopt rules under chapter 208-660 WAC to clarify the requirements related to advertising, permissible fees, and data security and notification of security events. Also, make technical or other changes as may be required by changes to state or federal law.

Uniform Money Services Act. Begin, finalize, and adopt rules under chapter 208-690 WAC to add provisions to strengthen consumer protections related to virtual currency, and clarify the requirements related to data security and notification of security events. Also, make technical or other changes as may be required by changes to state or federal law.

DIVISION OF SECURITIES

Updates to the investment adviser rules in chapter 460-24A WAC. The division of securities (division) plans to propose amendments to the investment adviser rules contained in chapter 460-24A WAC to incorporate updates to similar rules adopted by the United States Securities and Exchange Commission and North American Securities Adminis-

trators Association (NASAA), including advertising rules, continuing education requirements, and rules concerning unpaid arbitration awards.

Updates to the franchise rules in chapter 460-80 WAC. The division plans to propose amendments to the franchise rules contained in chapter 460-80 WAC to incorporate updates, including updates to NASAA model rules applicable to franchise offerings.

Updates to the municipal securities exemption in WAC 460-42A-030. The division is considering possible amendments to the municipal securities exemption in WAC 460-42A-030.

Announcing The Department of Ecology's (Ecology) Report to the Legislature on Priority Consumer Products Implementing Chapter 70A.350 RCW

The Pollution Prevention for Healthy People and Puget Sound Act (chapter 70A.350 RCW) requires ecology to submit a report to the legislature by June 1, 2025 that identifies priority consumer products for cycle 2 of the safer products for Washington program. It also requires ecology to notify the public about the selected products, including the identification of the peer-reviewed science and other sources of information that ecology relied upon, the basis for the selection, and a draft schedule for making regulatory determinations. This notice fulfills the notice requirement of RCW 70A.350.050 (4) (a).

Ecology published the Identification of Priority Products: Safer Products for Washington Cycle 2 Implementation Phase 2 report to the legislature and technical supporting documentation on May 30, 2025. This report contains information about the identified priority consumer products that are significant sources or uses of priority chemicals or chemical classes for potential regulation under the Safer Products for Washington program.

Ecology published a draft report on November 1, 2024, and held a 60-day public comment period to allow interested parties and the public to review and comment on the draft priority consumer products selected. After considering the comments received on the draft report, we finalized our designation of priority products. Ecology identified nine new priority consumer products for further evaluation and potential regulation. They are listed in Table 1 below.

We also plan to continue or expand our work to assess priority product-chemical combinations identified either in previous review cycles or in statute.

**Announcing the Draft Puget Sound Nutrient
General Permit for Review and Comment**

The Washington state department of ecology (ecology) proposes to revise and reissue the Puget Sound nutrient general permit, a national pollutant discharge elimination system and state waste discharge permit. The permit was issued in December 2021 and is scheduled to expire at the end of December 2026. In February 2025, the pollution control hearings board invalidated the Puget Sound nutrient general permit "insofar as it is mandatory" and remanded the permit back to ecology for further action. The draft permit, original fact sheet, and fact sheet amendment, explaining the legal and technical basis for the permit revision, are available for review and public comment from 9:00 a.m. on June 18, 2025, through 11:59 p.m. on July 25, 2025.

Purpose of the Permit: The voluntary Puget Sound nutrient general permit addresses excess nutrients from domestic wastewater treatment plants (WWTPs) discharging to marine and estuarine water of the Salish Sea in Washington. There are 58 such WWTPs eligible for the permit. Facilities can voluntarily apply for coverage under the general permit to address nitrogen reduction. The permit focuses only on controlling nutrients and works in conjunction with facilities' existing individual permits.

Applying for Coverage Under the Permit: In April 2025, we sent a letter to permittees terminating coverage under the original permit issued in 2021. The draft revised permit offers voluntary coverage for facilities that want to continue under the general permit to address nitrogen reduction. Facilities may obtain permit coverage by submitting a complete permit application to ecology and satisfying all applicable public notice requirements (WAC 173-226-200). An application will be available at <https://ecology.wa.gov/NutrientPermit>.

The hearing provides an opportunity for people to give formal oral testimony on the draft permit. Oral testimony will receive the same consideration as written comments submitted to ecology. The public hearing will begin immediately fol-

lowing the presentation and will conclude when public testimony is finished. The Puget Sound nutrient general permit informational presentations will occur online via Zoom on Tuesday, July 1, 2025, at 10:00 a.m., and on Monday, July 21, 2025, at 5:30 p.m. The public hearing will occur immediately following the presentation and Q&A session on Monday, July 21, 2025. After ecology receives and considers all public comments, we will make a final decision on permit issuance. Ecology expects to make a decision on the final general permit in September 2025.
