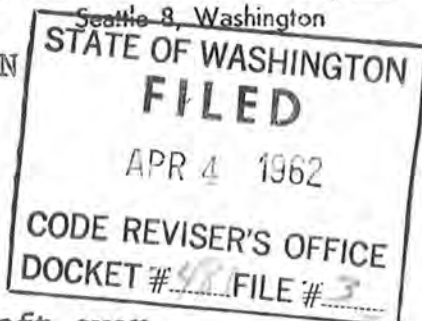

Regulation No. 8



Voluntarily Parachuting from Aircraft

WHEREAS, voluntarily parachuting from aircraft over congested areas or airports constitutes a hazard and indicates the need of regulations commensurate with and for the purpose of protecting and insuring the general public interest and safety of persons operating, using or traveling in aircraft and the safety of persons and property on land or water,

THEREFORE, under the authority and jurisdiction vested in the Washington State Aeronautics Commission for and on behalf of the citizens of the State of Washington, it is deemed necessary to issue the following regulation:

No person shall voluntarily parachute jump from any aircraft into the congested areas of cities, towns and/or settlements, or an open air assembly of persons without prior approval of the executive authority of the political subdivision involved and written notice to the Washington State Aeronautics Commission.

In no event shall a person voluntarily parachute into the traffic pattern of an airport unless with prior approval of the airport owner or manager and prior written notice to the Washington State Aeronautics Commission. The owner or operator of the airport shall mark the runway of the airport so as to indicate closure.

Authority for this order is derived from RCW 14.04.010, 14.04.070 and 14.04.210.
