NOXIOUS WEEDS OF WASHINGTON

I, Joe Dyer, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 11, Laws 1961 (Chapter 15.48 RCW), after due notice as provided in Chapter 42.32 RCW and in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act (Chapter 24.04 RCW), hereby adopt the following regulations relating to noxious weeds:

Regulation 1. Primary (Prohibited) Noxious Weed Seeds.



ADDENDUM TO ORDER NO. 839

The adoption of Order No. 839 pertaining to noxious weed seeds is necessary for the immediate preservation of the general welfare; it is necessary that the Order listing those weeds described as Primary Noxious Weed Seeds and Secondary Noxious Weed Seeds become effective immediately in order to prevent in so far as possible the germination of seeds that will be progeny of the parent generation in early stages of growth at the effective date of this Order.
