REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO THE USE OF INSECTICIDES ON CORN IN THE
COLUMBIA BASIN IRRIGATION PROJECT

I, Donald W. Moos, Director of Agriculture, of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapters 17.21 and 15.57 RCW, after due notice as provided under Chapters 34.04 and 42.32 RCW, and a public hearing held in Moses Lake on January 29, 1970, do hereby promulgate the following regulations relating to the restricted use of insecticides on corn actively shedding pollen.

Regulation 1. Definition: The term "actively shedding pollen" as related to any given corn field regulated under this Order shall be that stage of growth when 10 per cent or more of the corn plants in any one quarter portion of that field are showing spike anthers.

Regulation 2. Restricted Use Insecticides. The agricultural insecticides 1-Naphthyl-n-methyl carbamate, hereafter referred to as Carbaryl (Sevin); O,O-diethyl O-p-nitrophenyl phosphorothioate, hereafter referred to as Parathion; O,O-dimethyl O-p-nitrophenyl phosphorothioate, hereafter referred to as Methyl Parathion; O,O-dimethyl dithiophosphate of diethyl mercaptosuccinate, hereafter referred to as Malathion; Hexachlorohexahydromethano-2,4,3-benzodioxathiepin oxide, hereafter referred to as Endosulfan (Thiodan); O,O-diethyl O-(2-isopropyl-4-methyl-6-pyrimidinyl) phosphorothioate, hereafter referred to as Diazinon; and S-methyl N-(methylcarbamoyl)oxythioacetimidate ²/₂ hereafter referred to as Methomyl (Lannate); and 2-chloro-1-(2,4,5-trichloro phenyl) vinyl dimethyl phosphate, hereafter referred to as Gardona are by this Order declared to be restricted use insecticides. Such insecticides are restricted in their use in certain designated areas of the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project in the State of Washington.

Regulation 3. Area Under Order. This area includes all the irrigable lands in Grant, Adams, and Franklin Counties which are within the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project.

Regulation 4. Area 1. This area includes all the irrigable lands in Grant County which are within the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project lying north of U.S. Highway 10, starting from a point at Vantage on the west; thence easterly on U.S. Highway 10 to the Adams County Line.

Regulation 5. Area 2. This area includes all the irrigable lands lying within Blocks 12, 14, 15, 16, 19, 20, 23, and 201 which are within the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project lying north and west of a line starting at a point at the southwest corner of Unit 232 of Block 15; thence east along the unit line to the Ringold Eltopia Road; thence east along the Ringold Eltopia Road to its junction with the Glade Road; thence north along the Glade Road to the Potholes East Canal; thence northeast along the Potholes East Canal to a point at the northeast corner of Unit 1 of Block 12, all lying in Franklin County.

Regulation 6. Area 4. This area includes those irrigable lands in Blocks 15 and 16 encompassed by a line starting at the Columbia River and the northwest corner of Section 24, T11N, R28E; thence east 3 miles, more or less, along the section lines and the Elm Road to the Taylor Flats Road; thence south 4 miles, more or less, along the Taylor Flats Road to the Birch Road; thence west along the Birch Road 2 miles, more or less, to the Cypress Road; thence southwesterly along the Cypress Road to the Columbia River; thence north along the Columbia River 4 miles more or less to the point of beginning.

Regulation 7. Areas 1, 2, & 4. Restrictions on Pollen Shedding Corn. The use of Carbaryl (Sevin), Parathion, Malathion Dust and Methyl Parathion in any combination on pollen shedding corn is prohibited. The application of Diazinon, Endosulfan (Thiodan), Methomyl (Lannate), Gardona, and Malathion Liquid on pollen shedding corn is prohibited between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.


Regulation 8. Area 5. (The Royal Slope). This area includes all irrigable lands in Blocks 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, 85, 86, 87, 88, and 881 in an area generally bounded on the north by the Frenchman Hills, on the east and south by Crab Creek and on the west by the Columbia River.

Area 5 Restrictions. The use of Carbaryl (Sevin), Parathion, Methyl Parathion and Malathion Dust in any combination on pollen shedding corn is prohibited. This area is unrestricted as to the use of Diazinon, Endosulfan (Thiodan), Methomyl (Lannate), Gardona and Malathion Liquid in any combination or formulation on pollen shedding corn.

Regulation 9. Area 3. This area includes all remaining irrigable lands in Grant, Adams, and Franklin Counties which are within the Columbia Basin Irrigation Project that are not included in Areas 1 and 2.

Area 3 Restrictions. This area is unrestricted as to the use of Carbaryl (Sevin), Parathion, Methyl Parathion, Malathion, Diazinon, Endosulfan (Thiodan), Methomyl (Lannate) and Gardona in any combination or formulation on pollen shedding corn.
