EMERGENCY ORDER NO. 1165
Amending Order No. 1117
RELATING TO BRAND INSPECTION
Effective October 1, 1970

NEW WAC 16-620-003 PROMULGATION. (This emergency promul-
gation relates only to WAC 16-620-020, WAC 16-620-100 and
WAC 16-620-110.)

The adoption of this emergency order is necessary to
protect the public health and welfare by providing for
adequate identification and brand inspection of livestock.

I, Donald W. Moos, Director of Agriculture of the
State of Washington, by the virtue of the authority vested
in me under chapter 16.57 RCW do hereby promulgate the
following emergency regulations amending Order No. 1117
as amended by Order No. 1160 and WAC 16-620-020 and adding
two new sections, WAC 16-620-100 and WAC 16-620-110.

AMD WAC 16-620-020 POINT OF INSPECTION. Except as other-
wise set forth in the following regulation, all cattle shall
be brand inspected.

- (1) Prior to moving out of state.
- (2) Prior to sale at a public livestock market.
- (3) Prior to slaughter at a state or federally
inspected slaughterhouse.
- (4) Upon entry or reentry and prior to comming-
ling with other cattle at a commercial feed lot
approved as a brand inspection point by the
director.
- (5) At any point of sale or the taking of pos-
session by an intended purchaser or his agent
subject to title passing upon the meeting or
satisfaction of certain conditions: Provided,
that the provisions of this subsection shall not
apply to dairy breed cows and heifer calves being
sold or purchased for milk production purposes only.

NEW WAC 16-620-100 PRESCRIBED BILL OF SALE FORM. The
certificate of permit and bill of sale form incorporated
herein shall constitute the official form for branded
cattle prescribed by the director under the provisions of
RCW 16.57.250; provided, that such certificate of permit
and bill of sale has been presented to a brand inspector
for validation and has been validated within seven days
of the sale of the cattle subject to brand inspection under
the provisions of WAC 16-620-020.

NEW

WAC 16-620-110 PURCHASE OF OFFICIAL FORMS. Books of the official certificate of permit and bill of sale may be obtained from the Regulatory Services Division of the Department upon payment of fifty cents (50¢) for the cost of printing and handling of each such book.
