SCHEDULE OF GRAIN, HAY, BEANS AND PEAS FEES

I, Joe Dwyer, Director of Agriculture, State of Washington, after public notice and hearing held at Olympia, Washington on July 27, 1959, by virtue of authority vested in me under Chapter 22.08, Revised Code of Washington, do hereby supersede Order No. 710 and Order No. 722 to read as follows:

Regulation 1. Definitions

Section 1. "Department" means the Washington State Department of Agriculture.

Section 2. "Overtime" means any time worked Saturdays, Sundays or Holidays and all time worked before 8:00 A.M. or after 5:00 P.M. on Monday through Friday. Where industries operate regular, sustained shifts other than specified herein, exceptions may be made at the discretion of the Department.

Regulation 2. Commodity Inspection Points

Section 1. The following cities in the State of Washington are hereby designated inspection points for the inspecting, weighing and grading of grain, hay, and other commodities: Pasco, Longview and Vancouver. (Spokane, Seattle and Tacoma are provided with inspection service by legislative act.) The fees and regulations for all inspection points will be the same, unless otherwise specifically provided. See RCW 22.08.030 of the "Laws Governing Public and Terminal Grain Warehouses."

Regulation 3. General Provisions for Hourly Charges

Section 1. The hourly rates for service, where not otherwise specifically provided shall be as follows:

1. Rate per hour, straight time . . . . .  
(Minimum charge 1 hour). . . . . \$ 3.00  
(On any job where tonnage or other fee is too small to provide revenue of \$3.00 per hour, per man, the hourly rate may be applied.)

Section 1 (Continued)

- 2. Standby , straight time . . . . . per hour . . \$ 3.00
- 3. Overtime rate . . . . . per hour . . \$ 4.50

Section 2. Whenever overtime is required for the performance of any services for which the fee charged is on a tonnage, car or sample basis or for the inspection of ships as to condition for cargo, such overtime will be charged at the rate of \$3.00 per hour in addition to the regular fee.

Section 3. Whenever overtime is required Saturdays, Sundays or Holidays or an employee is called from his home after regular working hours, a minimum of four hours will be charged.

Regulation 4. Physical Analyses

Section 1. Moisture determination, grain (Letter or call, no certificate) . . . . . \$ .50

Section 2. Smut determination (Letter or call, no certificate) . . . . . \$ .50

Section 3. Requested additional factors that do not affect the grade. . . . . \$ .50

Section 4. Rodent pellet count (Request sample and certificate) . . . . . \$ 2.50

Section 5. Rodent pellet count (File sample and certificate) . . . . . \$ 1.50

Regulation 5. Certificates

Section 1. Copies of certificates after original issuance each run . . . . . \$ .25  
(The above shall apply to "Divided Original" export certificates. Each numbered set of certificates shall constitute a "run".

Regulation 6. Inspection and Weighing Fees

Section 1. Combination inspection and weighing charges:

(per ton) 1. Bulk grain, to or from bins, ships or barges . \$ .06

(per ton) 2. Sacked grain. . . . . \$ .10

Section 2. Trucks:

1. Inspecting and/or weighing per truck  
and/or trailer . . . . . \$ 2.00

Section 3. Weighing only:

1. Weighing bulk commodities. . . .per ton. . . . \$ .05

Section 4. Inspection:

1. Certificate of grade issued for cars on hold tracks  
or at plants . . . . . \$ 1.75  
2. Reinspections (Grade changed, fee cancelled) . . \$ 3.50  
3. Submitted samples (or sample inspections). . . . \$ .75  
4. Inspection of ships as to condition. . . . . \$25.00

Regulation 7. Inspection of Miscellaneous Commodities

Section 1. Hay Inspection:

1. Complete inspection (Minimum charge \$5.00)  
per ton. . . . . \$ .50  
2. Partial inspection (Minimum charge \$5.00)  
per ton. . . . . \$ .50  
3. Submitted sample inspection. . . . .each . . \$ 1.00

Section 2. Inspection of beans, peas and similar commodities  
(minimum charge \$2.00)

1. Inspection in bags of 100 lbs. or equivalent  
per bag. . . . . \$ .02  
2. Inspection, bulk . . . . . per 100 lbs \$ .02  
3. Submitted sample inspection. . per sample. . . \$ 3.00

Regulation 8. Miscellaneous

Section 1. Weighing, checking and/or sampling flour  
(minimum charge \$3.00) . . . . . per ton . . . . \$ .05

Section 2. Mailing samples . . . .Minimum charge . . . \$ .50

Section 3. Sampling only, bulk commodities

minimum charge. . . . . \$ 1.00

Section 4. Sampling only, sacked commodities

hourly rate . . . . . \$ 3.00

Section 5. Car Mileage . . . . . per mile. . . . \$ .08

Regulation 9. Services Rendered Away From Inspection Points

Section 1. The provisions of this regulation shall apply to the grading, weighing, sampling and inspection of grain, hay, and other commodities at places other than inspection points. In addition to the applicable fees for such services, the applicant shall pay the following costs:

1. Time per hour, per man, including overtime if any, from office and return.
2. Mileage from office and return except when transportation is furnished by the applicant.
3. Subsistence allowance if employee is away from station after 5:00 P.M. first day and all subsequent days.
4. Incidental costs for postage, telephone, etc.

Regulation 10.

Section 1. In all cases where no fee has been established for services, the charge for such service shall be as provided in Regulation 3.
