WASHINGTON STANDARDS FOR GIFT PACKAGES OF FRUIT

680  
The adoption of this Emergency Order No. 868 establishing standards for gift grades of fruit is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare. It is necessary that this Order become effective immediately in order that the Director provide adequate standards and proper grades for the grading of such fruits.


Now, therefore, I, Joe Dwyer, Director of Agriculture of the State of Washington, by virtue of the authority vested in me under Chapter 15.16 and 34.04 Revised Code of Washington, after due notice and public hearing held at Ellensburg on September 8, 1961 do establish the following "Gift Grade" for fruit.

Regulation 1.

Section 1. "GIFT GRADE" may consist of mixed varieties (apples and pears) and in the case of apples shall meet Washington Extra Fancy grade as defined in Order No. 791, Washington Standards for Apples, and in the case of pears shall be U.S. No. 1 or higher grade as defined in Order No. 322, Standards for D'Anjou, Bosc, Winter Nelis and other Varieties of Winter Pears.

When gift containers meet the requirements of section 1 above such containers need be marked only "GIFT GRADE" and a statement of net contents in weight and name and address of packer or shipper.
