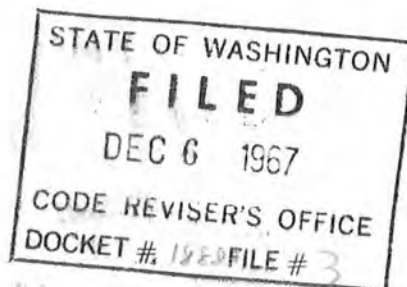
Dear Mr. White:

Rule .04.040 - Delete-Section as follows:

" The Ring Padding shall consist of one one inch layer of  
"Ensolute Boxing Ring Pad" or similar material. The padding  
described above will be required for all Boxing Matches  
effective 7/1/64."

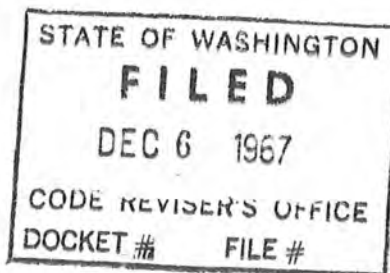

Rule .04.410 ( 13) Underlined Portion be Added:

No wrestler shall deliberately leave the ring during the  
course of any match except during a rest period and then  
only with the consent of the referee. Under no circumstances  
shall any wrestling be conducted outside of the ring. If  
a wrestler deliberately steps outside of the ropes he may  
immediately be disqualified and his purse may be paid to the  
commission for whatever disposition it may deem appropriate.

Rule .04.030 (1)-Delete 1st sentence to and including the word Inspector, and to substitute the following language:

Contestants shall be weighed on the date of the scheduled match, at the time designated by the Commission, in the presence of each other, a Commission Inspector and an official of the club promoting the match, on club scales or other scales approved by the Commission or at such place or places as may be designated by consent of Commission Inspector.

Page 11- Administrative Code 36-12-030 (1)

Rule 04.180 (2) Underlined portion be added to Rule. The Chief Inspectors shall select and assign inspectors, timekeepers, referees, announcers and Judges for all bouts held in their respective districts unless the Commission directs otherwise.

Page 22- Administrative Code 26-12-180 (2)

Rule .04.310 (4) Underlined portion be added to Rule: The Commission physician at ringside will have the authority to stop a fight when he considers a boy badly injured or in no shape to continue. Whenever a fight is stopped between rounds by the physician or otherwise because of injuries, the opponent shall be credited with a TKO for the round just concluded. No bout shall be allowed to proceed unless the physician is in his seat. This also applies, where applicable, to the wrestling matches.

Page 34- Administrative Code- 36-12-300 (4)

Rule .04.320 (12) Entire Section Shown below be deleted. "During the first fifteen days of a suspension following a knockout, a boxer shall refrain from any contact training. If such boxer suffers a knockout in his next bout or within three months following a previous knockout he shall be suspended from boxing for a period of six months. For three months at the beginning of this interval he shall refrain from any contact training in the gymnasium. It shall be the responsibility of the boxer's manager, or the boxer himself to see that he complies with rule and any violation may

Page 35 Administrative Code 36-12-320 (12)

New Rule required under 1967 Administrative Procedures Act  
amendment 2, Chapter 237, Laws of 1967:

" The State Athletic Commission composed of three members  
appointed by the governor is generally responsible for the  
supervision, licensing and control of all boxing contests  
and wrestling matches or exhibitions conducted within the state.  
The commission functions through announced periodic official  
commission meetings, throughout the state, which are open to the  
public, and conducts hearings in accordance with the practice  
and procedural rules, WAC 36-08-020 through WAC 36-08-520 where  
required. State inspectors are appointed by the commission to  
perform various duties as contained in WAC 36-12-190. The commission  
also employs a secretary. Submissions, inquiries and requests  
may be directed to the athletic Commission secretary, in care  
of the commission office, 210 East Union, Olympia, Washington  
98501 (telephone 753-6478).

Rule .04.140-On page 2 of the mimeographed sheet the following  
rule is to be deleted:

" When a boxer is knocked out, the referee shall perform a full  
ten second count. Except in the final round of a bout, when a  
round in any boxing contest shall terminate before a contestant  
who has been knocked down shall risen from the floor of the ring,  
the time-keeper's count shall be continued. If the fallen  
contestant shall fail to rise before the count of ten, he shall  
be considered to have lost the bout by a knockout in the round  
lately concluded".
