in Making Powers of Director of Licenses - Express or implied

1. The Bd. - Meetings shall be held at least once a year at such place as the D of Licenses shall determine
2. Persons licensed to practice chiropractic under the laws of any other state having equal requirements of this chapter, may, in the discretion of the director, be issued a license to practice without exam.
1919 C 5 & 14.
3. D of Licenses may refuse to grant or may revoke a license, or may cause a licensee's name to be removed from county clerk's records if on any of the following grounds:
 - a. employment of fraud or deception in applying for a license
 - b. " " " " " in passing an exam.
 - c. Practice of chiropractic under a false or assumed name.
 - d. The impersonation of another practitioner of like a different name.
 - e. Conviction of a crime involving moral turpitude.
 - f. Habitual intemperance in the use of ardent spirits, narcotics or stimulants to such an extent as to incapacitate him or her for the performance of their professional duties.
 - g. Exploiting or advertising thru the press, or by the use of handbills, circulars or other periodicals, other than professional cards, giving only name, address, profession, office hours and telephone connections.

Licensee or applicant, ^{so charged} shall be furnished a copy of the complaint and have a hearing before said D or person or by attorney
4. D may within 2 yrs after refusal, revocation or cancellation issue a new license or grant a license to such person. 1919 C 5 & 8
5. Satisfactory proof showing attendance at a symposium. 1959 C 53 & 5
6. It shall be the duty of the D of Licenses to aid (a prosecuting attorney, attorneys of the state, charged with prosecuting those who violate provisions of this chapter)

Chiropractic Examiners

Function of Board.

§ 25.015 - Board created to conduct examinations and perform duties as provided in this chapter.

Pay for conducting exams, the preparation of exam. questions, & the grading of exam papers -
To accredit and approve chiropractic schools or colleges (By implication from statement that each applicant must be a graduate of such approved accredited school.)
Exams by Board to be by method deemed by the board to be most practical and expeditious to test the applicants' qualifications.

Express power to make rules

§ 25.017 - The Board may make such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with this chapter, as it deems necessary to carry out the provisions of this chapter.

Standards set up by legislature

1. All exams to be made in writing
2. Subject of exam shall be: anatomy, physiology, hygiene, symptomatology, nerve-tracing, chiropractic-orthopedy, principles of chiropractic and adjusting as taught by chiropractic schools & colleges.
3. License to be granted if applicant answers correctly 75% of all questions asked & 60% of the questions on each steady branch of the exam.

Policy Concerning License Renewal as Regards Attendance at Symposiums. — It shall be the policy of this Board to recommend to the Director of Licenses that the symposium requirement may be waived for an individual for good cause shown.

Statute Law requires that a license be obtained from the Director of Licenses in Olympia before a person can practice chiropractic. It prohibits certain acts that lead to wrongfully obtaining a license or inducing a belief in others that a person is licensed.

~~All Applications to practice must be accompanied by a fee of \$10.00 and an additional fee~~
Each applicant for a license must pay to Director a fee of \$25.00, \$10.00 of which shall accompany the application and the remaining \$15.00 shall be paid upon the issuance of the license.

Initial licensing is predicated upon successful completion of an examination coupled with certain educational requirements and evidence of good reputation, or in the case of applicants already licensed in another State having equal requirements to those of Washington, then upon the discretion of the Director.

The annual renewal of license fee is \$15.00 payable on or before the 1st of September. Renewal applications must be accompanied by ~~satisfactory~~ ^{an} proof that the applicant has attended ~~one or more~~ approved Chiropractic symposiums during the preceding year.

~~Licensees~~ must be recorded in the county clerk's office wherein the licensee resides, ^{and in the county clerk's office where} ~~as well as in the~~ ^{he practices} ~~the county clerk's office~~ where he practices.

The Director of License may refuse to grant a license or may revoke a license for:

1. Fraud or deception ^{when} applying for a license or in passing an examination.
2. Practice under a false or assumed name or impersonation of another practitioner ~~of the same name~~.
3. Conviction of a crime involving moral turpitude.
4. Habitual intemperance affecting his ~~practice~~ practice.
5. Wrongful advertising.

Any person so charged ~~whether an applicant or a licensee~~ must be furnished a copy of the complaint and have a hearing before the Director ~~person or by attorney~~.

A Board of Chiropractic examiners is created to prepare and conduct examinations as well as to recognize and approve chiropractic symposiums. It is expressly empowered to "make such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with the statutory chapter creating it" — "as it deems necessary to carry out the provisions of" — (the statutory chapter creating it)

Boards' rule making powers, express, or implied from: -

1. A state board of 3 practicing chiropractors was created "to conduct examinations and perform duties as provided in this chapter" 1959 C 53 S 1

5. Examinations shall be made by the Board according to the method deemed by it to be the most practical, and expeditious to test the applicants qualifications. All exams shall be made in writing, the subject of which shall be as follows: anatomy, etc. 1959 C 53 S 4. A license shall be granted to all applicants who shall correctly answer 75% of all questions asked, and if any applicant shall fail to answer correctly 60% of the questions on any branch of said examination, he or she shall not be entitled to a license.
