WAC 132S-29-010 INTRODUCTION. All students attending Columbia Basin College and receiving federal assistance in meeting direct and/or indirect educational costs through grants, work-study, and/or loans must maintain good academic standing.

WAC 132S-29-020 FAILURE TO MAINTAIN GOOD ACADEMIC STANDING Failure to maintain good academic standing will result in the termination of financial aid payments until satisfactory progress can be documented by the student.

WAC 132S-29-030 DEFINITIONS. For purposes of financial aid, the student is considered to be in good standing unless he fails to complete a minimum of 10 credit hours with a grade point average of 2.00 for two consecutive quarters. However, a part-time student who fails to complete six credit hours in any quarter will be subject to immediate termination of financial aid.
