A RESOLUTION Relating to emergency rules of the State Board for Community College Education.


WHEREAS the State Board for Community College Education finds that the immediate adoption of Washington Administrative Code regulations governing the granting of general salary increases for community college professional personnel is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, and general welfare and that the observation of the requirement of notice and opportunity to present views and proposed action will be contrary to the public interest in that negotiations pursuant to Chapter 28B.52 RCW on such matters could occur prior to the next opportunity to adopt permanent regulations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the State Board for Community College Education that it adopt Resolution No. 74-9 attached hereto and made a part hereof as emergency rules for the community college system.

This resolution and annexed regulatory resolution after being first recorded as an administrative order in the Order Register of the State Board for Community College Education shall be forwarded to the Code Reviser for filing as emergency rules pursuant to Chapter 34.04 RCW.

STATE BOARD FOR COMMUNITY COLLEGE EDUCATION

RESOLUTION NO. 74-9

A resolution relating to the expenditure of appropriated general fund and budgeted local revenues for salary increase purposes:

WHEREAS the Community College Legislative Council adopted a position recommending an eleven percent average 1974-75 salary increase for professional personnel, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Legislative Council position, the State Director advocated such salary increases at recent hearings of the Senate and House Ways and Means Committees, and

WHEREAS from a practical standpoint the effect of implementing salary increases specifically designated by the Legislature during the past five years has been the evolution of a policy that such increases are made only pursuant to a special appropriation for that purpose, and

WHEREAS such legislative policy has been supported by OPP&FM instructions that remove specific salary increase recommendations from the budget requesting process for general operating funds for state agencies, and

WHEREAS Governor Evans recommended a January 1, 1975, salary increase of four percent to the 3rd Extraordinary Session of the 43rd Legislature, and

WHEREAS the 3rd Extraordinary Session of the 43rd Legislature of the State of Washington has recessed without appropriating funds to provide salary increases for community college employees, and

WHEREAS no general operating funds are available for the purpose of granting salary increases for academic year 1974-75, and

WHEREAS the granting of any salary increases for academic year 1974-75 in the absence of a specific legislative appropriation for that purpose would require program reductions, diminished services to existing and prospective students, and further postponement of needed expenditures for instructional supplies and equipment, maintenance and repairs, and library support, and

WHEREAS, although the State Board was successful in obtaining a supplemental operating budget appropriation for academic year 1974-75, the appropriation specifically prohibits its use for salary increases, and

WHEREAS granting general salary increases from funds other than those specifically appropriated for salary increases would be inconsistent with these efforts to secure adequate funding and the desire to continue current levels of service pursuant to the open door policy,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the State Board for Community College Education that the various college district boards of trustees refrain from granting to non-civil service personnel any general salary increases for academic year 1974-75, either from appropriated general fund or budgeted local revenues; however, district boards may implement existing salary administration plans and schedules by granting incremental and/or promotional advancements as therein provided, when in the judgment of the district board of trustees sufficient funds to do so are available, such amounts not to exceed the total monetary amount of increments established in the 1973-74 schedules. Districts without a specifically identified incremental feature in the salary schedule may pay a maximum of the systemwide average incremental percentage;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Director in the January, 1975, legislative session continue to seek salary increases for community college employees and thereafter implement any such increases as may be approved by the Legislature.
