
A resolution relating to the waiver of tuition and fees for certain community college students.

WHEREAS the State Board for Community College Education finds that the immediate adoption of rules relating to the waiver of tuition and fees is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, and general welfare and that the observation of the requirement of notice and opportunity to present views and proposed action will be contrary to the public interest in that there exists a need to give the amendment immediate effect; to wit: The rules as revised should apply to enrollments for the Fall Quarter, 1975, most or all of which would have been completed before a permanent rule would be effective.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the State Board for Community College Education that it adopt Administrative Order No. 46 and the annexed regulation identified as WAC 131-28-030 through WAC 131-28-070 and made a part hereof by this reference, as an emergency rule.

This resolution and the annexed regulation, after being first recorded as an Administrative Order in the Order Register of the State Board for Community College Education, shall be forwarded to the Code Reviser for filing as an emergency rule pursuant to Chapter 34.04 RCW.

WAC 131-28-030 WAIVER OF TUITION AND FEES FOR CERTAIN STUDENTS. Pursuant to authority granted by RCW 28B.15.520 and RCW 28B.15.530, the boards of trustees of community college districts are authorized to waive all or part of general tuition, operating, and services and activities fees for: (1) students enrolled in a course of study or program specifically for the purpose of completing a high school education and obtaining a high school diploma or certificate, (2) students enrolled in collegiate-level courses or programs, and (3) children after the age of nineteen years of any law enforcement officer or fire fighter who lost his life or became totally disabled in the line of duty while employed by a public law enforcement agency or full time or volunteer fire department in this state; provided the student, except those designated in subsection (3) above, shall qualify for such waiver as determined by the criteria set forth in WAC 131-28-040 through WAC 131-28-050.

WAC 131-28-040 CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING ELIGIBILITY FOR WAIVER OF TUITION AND FEES UNDER RCW 28B.15.530. Waiver of general tuition, operating, and services and activities fees, or any portions thereof as authorized by RCW 28B.15.530, normally charged to students enrolled in collegiate-level courses or programs shall be based upon the determination that the student is a needy or disadvantaged student by application of a method of need analysis approved by the United States Office of Education for determining awards under federal student financial aid programs, provided that no waivers under this section shall be granted to a person who is not a "resident student" as defined in RCW 28B.15.010.

WAC 131-28-041 CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING ELIGIBILITY FOR WAIVER OF TUITION AND FEES UNDER RCW 28B.15.520. Waiver of general tuition, operating, and services and activities fees, or any portions thereof as authorized by RCW 28B.15.520, normally charged to students enrolled in high school completion courses or programs shall be based upon the determination that the student is a needy student by application of need analysis based upon data provided on the form: Fee Waiver Application for High School Completion.* If a student is concurrently enrolled in collegiate-level and high school completion courses or programs, determination of need shall be based upon criteria established by WAC 131-28-040.

WAC 131-28-045 PROCEDURE FOR IMPLEMENTING TUITION AND FEE WAIVERS AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO RCW 28B.15.520 AND RCW 28B.15.530.

(1) Tuition and fee waivers for needy or disadvantaged students as authorized by RCW 28B.15.520 and RCW 28B.15.530 may not exceed three percent of any college district's estimated total collections of tuition, operating, and services and activities fees had no such waivers been made, after deducting the portion of that total amount which is attributable to the difference between resident and non-resident tuition and fees.

(2) The estimated total collection of tuition and fees shall be based on the budgeted, state supported, four-quarter annual average enrollment, minus the actual tuition and fees collected for the summer quarter of the year being estimated.

(3) Each district may waive an amount not to exceed three percent of the estimated collections in the event that actual enrollments or collections exceed estimated collections. Conversely, the three percent waiver capacity based upon estimated collections is allowable even though actual collections may not be as high as the estimate.

(4) Districts desiring to exceed their individual three percent waiver capacity may do so only upon written approval from the State Director of Community Colleges or his designee. Additional waiver capacity can only be granted to a district after it has been determined that the total waiver capacity for the community college system is not being utilized as a result of other districts waiving at levels less than the three percent capacity.

WAC 131-28-050 PROCEDURE FOR DETERMINING LIMITATION OF THE AMOUNT OF TUITION AND FEE WAIVERS. For the purpose of determining the amount of any fee waiver established under the provisions of WAC 131-28-030, the various community colleges will limit any individual award to the difference between the cost of attending the community college, including the cost requirements of the student, his dependents, and/or his family, and the expected parental and/or independent student contribution toward such cost.

WAC 131-28-060 PROCEDURE FOR DETERMINING PRIORITIES IN AWARDING FEE WAIVERS.

This section is repealed.

WAC 131-28-070 COMBINATION OF TUITION AND FEE WAIVERS WITH OTHER FORMS OF STUDENT FINANCIAL AID. Nothing in WAC 131-28-030 through WAC 131-28-050 is intended to prevent the award of tuition and fee waivers in conjunction with other forms of student financial aid as a package designed to meet the overall educational assistance needs of any student.
