Resolution 65-4.

A RESOLUTION Relating to an emergency regulation pertaining to the temporary exemption from license, permit and liability requirements of weather modification activities designed to disperse fogs at airports having full-time U. S. Weather Bureau Meteorologists.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WEATHER MODIFICATION BOARD, STATE OF WASHINGTON:

Section 1. The Weather Modification Board of the State of Washington, by virtue of authority vested in it under Chapter 43.37 RCW, after due notice as provided in Chapters 34.04 and 42.32 RCW and after a public hearing held in Seattle, Washington on February 11, 1965 promulgate the following regulations as set forth in Section 2 hereof.

Section 2. Regulation .090. Weather Modification activities designed to disperse fogs existing over airports or other aircraft landing facilities having United States Department of Commerce Weather Bureau meteorologists or meteorologists of the armed forces of the United States on duty at all times, shall be temporarily exempted from the license requirements of RCW 43.37.100, the permit requirements of RCW 34.37.110 and the liability requirements of RCW 43.37.150 for an emergency period of ninety (90) days provided: that the operator is the holder of a current Commercial Pilot's Certificate with instrument rating issued by the Federal Aviation Agency and provided further that the operator in the carrying out of the dispersal of fogs is fully advised of the pertinent weather information by the meteorologist on duty.

Section 3. The adoption of this regulation is necessary for the preservation of public health, safety and general welfare because:


(1) There presently exists a need to establish different standards of competence for applicants for a license depending upon the type of weather modification and control activity to be undertaken. There are no regulations now in effect that govern this matter.

(2) During the present season of winter, and early spring as well, certain fog conditions form which may be dispersed through weather modification techniques. This regulation provides that applicants not otherwise competent to engage in weather modification and control activities, may do so with regard to certain fog dispersal activities.

Section 4. This resolution shall remain in effect for ninety (90) days from the date of filing.

APPROVED AND ADOPTED by the Weather Modification Board this 11th day of February, 1965.
