

REGULATION NO. 25

REGULATION OF THE COUNTY ROAD ADMINISTRATION BOARD
AMENDING THE STANDARDS OF GOOD PRACTICE REGARDING
VACANCY IN THE POSTION OF COUNTY ROAD ENGINEER AND
PRIORITY PROGRAMMING PROCEDURES.

WHEREAS, Chapter 120, Laws of 1965, First Extraordinary Session,
created the County Road Administration Board to formulate and adopt
uniform and general practices relating to the administration of county
roads for the several counties of the state, and

WHEREAS, the Board deems it necessary to update existing standards
of good practice from time to time, Now, therefore,

BE IT ESTABLISHED BY THE COUNTY ROAD ADMINISTRATION
BOARD:

Section 1. The standard of good practice regarding vacancy in the
postion of county road engineer (WAC 136-12) be hereby amended in
accordance with the attached text.

Section 2. The standard of good practice regarding priority program-
ming procedures (WAC 136-14) be hereby amended in accordance with
the attached text.

Section 3. The standard as adopted hereby shall become effective
immediately and shall be adhered to by all counties in the state.

Established and adopted by the Board this 17 day of January,
1975, at a hearing held pursuant to notice given as required by law.

WAC 136-12-030 ACTING COUNTY ENGINEER. (1) If for any reason, it is impossible for the board to employ a new county road engineer immediately, the board shall designate, by resolution, the assistant county road engineer, or other road department employee, as the acting county road engineer for an interim period, not to exceed six months, except as provided in Section 060. A copy of such resolution shall be forwarded to the County Road Administration Board. (2) If the acting county road engineer is a licensed professional engineer he may perform all the duties of the county road engineer as specified in RCW 36.80. (3) If the acting county road engineer is not a licensed professional engineer, the board shall designate a licensed professional engineer to perform all engineering services during the interim period as required by Chapter 18.43 of the Revised Code of Washington, and the acting county road engineer shall perform only those functions of the office not requiring a professional engineer's license.

AMD. WAC 136-14-040 APPLICATION OF TECHNIQUE. The technique for roads shall be applied by the county engineer to all potential arterial projects in the county, and to access road projects if directed by the Board of County Commissioners. The resulting priority array shall be updated not later than June 1 of each odd-numbered year and shall be consulted together with bridge priorities by the board of county commissioners and county engineer during the preparation of the proposed six year program on which hearing is to be held prior to July 1 each year.

AMD. WAC 136-14-050 CERTIFICATION. In order to assure that priority arrays were available and were consulted during the preparation of the proposed six year program each year, the resolution of adoption of such program by each board of county commissioners shall include assurances to this effect. A copy of the adopting resolution shall be forwarded to the County Road Administration Board together with the six year program.
