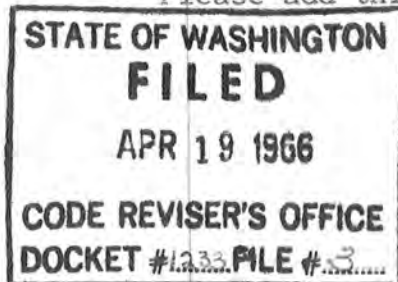
The Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors met and held a Public Hearing in Room 421, Highway-License Building, at 1:30 p.m., April 8, 1966, to consider the adoption of a rule which will require non-resident engineers who engage in Professional Engineering or Land Surveying practice in Washington for 30 days or less in any calendar year to report their presence and intention to the Board.

The following rule was adopted:

Every non-resident engineer or land surveyor who intends to conduct professional practice under the exemption of subsection 2 of section .130, RCW 18.43, shall furnish the Board, prior to the commencement of such work, with the following information:

1. Name and place of his residence.
2. Jurisdiction where currently registered.
3. Imprint of personal engineers seal.
4. Dates work is to be started and terminated in the State of Washington.
5. Name and Address of client.

Please add this to the rules adopted by this Board.
