8 "(4) \$211,000 of the general fund state appropriation is
9 provided solely for a study, conducted by energy office staff, of
10 prospects for providing for energy self-sufficiency,
11 environmental improvement and agricultural market expansion by
12 greater use of ethanol and other motor vehicle fuels that are
13 alternatives to gasoline. A fourteen-member committee, with
14 non-legislative members to be appointed by the director of the
15 energy office, shall provide advice regarding the study and shall
16 make recommendations to the legislature by December 1, 1992
17 regarding the state's role in developing ethanol and other
18 alternative fuels. The membership of the committee shall consist
19 of (a) two agricultural producers whose products have potential
20 for use as alternative fuels; (b) one producer of alternative
21 fuels; (c) one representative of an oil company; (d) one
22 representative of independent service station dealers; (e) one

1 representative from the automobile manufacturing industry; (f)
2 one member of the Washington State University faculty with
3 expertise in developing agricultural products; (g) one
4 representative of a consumer group; (h) the directors of the
5 department of agriculture and the energy office; and (i) two
6 members of the Senate, one from each caucus, one of whom serves
7 on the transportation committee, appointed by the president of
8 the Senate, and two members of the House of Representatives, one
9 from each caucus, one of whom serves on the agricultural
10 committee and one of whom serves on the energy committee,
11 appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives."

EFFECT: Increases the general fund state appropriation to the Energy Office by \$211,000 and provides that this amount is to be used for a study of potential for development of ethanol and other similar fuels. A committee is to advise the Energy Office regarding the study and to make recommendations to the legislature by December 1, 1992 regarding the state's role in the development of these fuels.
