- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The legislature finds that the
- 8 population of teens in Washington state will be increasing through the
- 9 mid-1990's, and that, in light of this increasing population, our state
- 10 has a growing need for highly skilled and motivated workers that are
- 11 members of healthy families. Therefore, Washington state cannot afford
- 12 to lose any teens to substance abuse, teen pregnancy, juvenile crime,
- 13 or dropping out of school. The legislature further finds that teens
- 14 who drop out of school are two to three times more likely to live in
- 15 poverty as adults. Teen mothers are less likely to finish high school,
- 16 more likely to be separated or divorced, and more likely to live in
- 17 poverty. Their children are more likely to exhibit lower academic
- 18 achievement and to show a tendency to repeat their mother's pattern of
- 19 early childbearing. Teens who abuse drugs and alcohol are more likely
- 20 to be school drop outs and engage in criminal behavior.
- 21 (2) The legislature further finds that the most effective strategy
- 22 to comprehensively meet the diverse needs of teens is through
- 23 collaborative efforts of government agencies, youth service
- 24 organizations, businesses, schools, parents, and teens to plan and
- 25 provide services to teens.
- 26 (3) The legislature further finds that local communities are best
- 27 able to determine the most appropriate design and location of programs
- 28 to comprehensively and cooperatively support teens in their community.

- 1 (4) The purpose of this chapter is to equip teens with the
- 2 resources, skills, knowledge, and motivation necessary to maintain a
- 3 healthy lifestyle and successfully enter the job market or pursue
- 4 higher education, through the establishment of community mobilization
- 5 projects for teens in six pilot sites geographically distributed
- 6 throughout the state."
- 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. Definitions. (1) "Department" means the
- 8 department of social and health services.
- 9 (2) "Secretary" means the secretary of the department of social and
- 10 health services.
- 11 (3) "Community" means an individual political subdivision of the
- 12 state, a group of such political subdivisions, or a geographic area
- 13 within a political subdivision."
- 14 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. (1) There is established in the
- 15 department a community mobilization program for teens, which may fund
- 16 and coordinate up to six community-based projects to develop targeted
- 17 and coordinated strategies to meet the needs of teens.
- 18 (2) Applications for project funding under this chapter shall:
- 19 (a) Define the community requesting funding;
- 20 (b) Contain evidence of the active participation of public and
- 21 private entities in the community, including the various communities of
- 22 color, that are now providing, or might appropriately provide, services
- 23 to teens, including, at a minimum, schools, law enforcement, local
- 24 government, libraries, youth services agencies and organizations, job
- 25 training organizations, mental health, and health care providers;
- 26 (c) Demonstrate establishment of a project advisory board composed
- 27 of teens, parents, and representatives of a broad cross-section of
- 28 other community members who have an interest in meeting the needs of

- 1 teens, and assure that the advisory board has been consulted in
- 2 development of the application;
- 3 (d) Designate a lead agency or organization for the project, and
- 4 provide evidence of written interagency agreements with existing youth
- 5 service organizations to carry out project activities. The agency or
- 6 organization designated as lead agency shall have demonstrated
- 7 sensitivity and responsiveness to the plurality of community values and
- 8 the cultural and ethnic heritage of community members;
- 9 (e) Identify a project site that is accessible to teens during
- 10 evenings and weekends, from which services and activities can be
- 11 provided or referrals made;
- 12 (f) Describe the services and activities that will be undertaken by
- 13 the project, including identification of specific services and
- 14 activities for which funding is requested. Core services provided at
- 15 each project site shall include, at a minimum: Health screening and
- 16 referrals; employment search and job training; mental health
- 17 counseling; substance abuse treatment; and family counseling. Health
- 18 screening and referrals shall not include the dispensing of
- 19 contraceptives. Referrals of pregnant teens for health care services
- 20 shall be to persons, agencies, or organizations with maternity care
- 21 services practices that primarily emphasize healthy birth outcomes.
- 22 Projects may address other local service needs such as drop-out
- 23 prevention, substance abuse prevention, inpatient substance abuse
- 24 treatment, additional support services for teen parents, literacy
- 25 programs, and recreational activities, by offering those services at
- 26 the project site or through referrals to community organizations;
- 27 (g) Describe the coordinated system for meeting the needs of teens
- 28 that the community will develop, including a description of how the
- 29 proposed system will build upon existing services and existing
- 30 community efforts to coordinate the delivery of services to teens;

- 1 (h) Identify community matching funds, as provided in section 4 of
- 2 this act, that have been committed to the project; and
- 3 (i) Provide assurances that the project will cooperate, through the
- 4 provision of requested data and information, with the evaluation
- 5 provided for in section 6 of this act."
- 6 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. (1) The secretary may issue grants for
- 7 community mobilization projects for teens. Grants shall be made
- 8 competitively based upon information provided in applications for
- 9 funding. To the greatest extent practicable, grants shall be
- 10 geographically distributed throughout the state.
- 11 (2) The department shall provide a staff person to administer and
- 12 coordinate the program established under this chapter, and shall
- 13 provide technical assistance to communities applying for or receiving
- 14 funds under this chapter.
- 15 (3) Technical assistance provided by the department shall include
- 16 the identification of means to creatively blend categorical funds, to
- 17 the extent not prohibited by federal law, in a manner that allows
- 18 teens' needs to determine the services they will receive.
- 19 (4) Twenty-five percent of the funding for projects under this
- 20 chapter shall be community matching funds provided by private or public
- 21 entities in the communities requesting funding. Contributions of
- 22 materials, supplies, or physical facilities may be considered as all or
- 23 part of the funding provided by the communities."
- 24 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. Community mobilization projects for
- 25 teens shall have an initial duration of two years. To the extent
- 26 funding is available, projects may be renewed for an additional two-
- 27 year period by the department."

- 1 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. The department shall contract with an
- 2 independent entity to evaluate the effectiveness of the program
- 3 established in this chapter. The evaluation shall develop standards
- 4 for measuring the success of community mobilization projects,
- 5 considering factors such as school completion, employment, and teen
- 6 pregnancy rates. The department shall submit an evaluation report to
- 7 appropriate committees of the legislature by December 1, 1994, and
- 8 biennially thereafter."
- 9 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. If any provision of this act or its
- 10 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 11 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 12 persons or circumstances is not affected."
- 13 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. If any part of this act is found to be
- 14 in conflict with federal requirements that are a prescribed condition
- 15 to the allocation of federal funds to the state, the conflicting part
- 16 of this act is inoperative solely to the extent of the conflict and
- 17 with respect to the agencies directly affected, and this finding does
- 18 not affect the operation of the remainder of this act in its
- 19 application to the agencies concerned. The rules under this act shall
- 20 meet federal requirements that are a necessary condition to the receipt
- 21 of federal funds by the state."
- 22 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 9. Sections 1 through 6 of this act shall
- 23 constitute a new chapter in Title 74 RCW."
- "NEW SECTION. Sec. 10. If by June 30, 1991, the omnibus
- 25 operating budget appropriations act for the 1991-93 biennium does not

- 1 provide specific funding for this act, referencing this act by bill
- 2 number, this act is null and void."
