11 On page 2, after line 5, insert the following:

12 "**Sec. 2.** RCW 46.61.655 and 1990 c 250 s 56 are each amended to
13 read as follows:

14 (1) No vehicle shall be driven or moved on any public highway
15 unless such vehicle is so constructed or loaded as to prevent any of
16 its load from dropping, sifting, leaking, or otherwise escaping
17 therefrom, except that sand may be dropped for the purpose of securing
18 traction. Any person operating a vehicle from which any glass or
19 objects have fallen or escaped, which would constitute an obstruction
20 or injure a vehicle or otherwise endanger travel upon such public
21 highway shall immediately cause the public highway to be cleaned of all
22 such glass or objects and shall pay any costs therefor.

23 (2) No person may operate on any public highway any vehicle with
24 any load unless the load and such covering as required thereon by
25 subsection (3) of this section is securely fastened to prevent the
26 covering or load from becoming loose, detached, or in any manner a

1 hazard to other users of the highway.

2 (3) Any vehicle operating on a paved public highway with a load of
3 dirt, sand, or gravel susceptible to being dropped, spilled, leaked, or
4 otherwise escaping therefrom shall be covered so as to prevent
5 spillage. Covering of such loads is not required if six inches of
6 freeboard is maintained within the bed.

7 (4) Any vehicle with deposits of mud, rocks, or other debris on the
8 vehicle's body, fenders, frame, undercarriage, wheels, or tires shall
9 be cleaned of such material before the operation of the vehicle on a
10 paved public highway.

11 (5) The state patrol may make necessary rules to carry into effect
12 the provisions of this section, applying such provisions to specific
13 conditions and loads and prescribing means, methods, and practices to
14 effectuate such provisions.

15 (6) Nothing in this section may be construed to prohibit a public
16 maintenance vehicle from dropping sand on a highway to enhance
17 traction, or sprinkling water or other substances to clean or maintain
18 a highway.

19 (7) This section does not apply to waste products falling from
20 vehicles hauling live farm animals when crossing a ferry capable only
21 of transporting fewer than twenty-five vehicles."
