If the estimated 1991-93 average

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biennial full time equivalent student enrollment of an institution or 1 2 branch campus (as estimated on April 30, 1993, by the office of financial management using spring enrollment reports submitted by the 3 4 institutions) varies from the biennial budgeted amount by more than four percent above or two percent below the budgeted amount, or twelve 5 б percent above or below the budgeted amount for each branch campus, then an amount equal to the student quality standard multiplied by the 7 number of full time equivalent students above or below the variances 8 9 shall revert to the state general fund. The variance allowance for the state board for community and technical colleges excludes the technical 10 colleges. 11
