# HOUSE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

Majority Report: Do pass. Signed by 19 members: Representatives Appelwick, Chair; Ludwig, Vice Chair; Padden, Ranking Minority Member; Paris, Assistant Ranking Minority Member; Belcher; Broback; Forner; Hargrove; Inslee; Locke; R. Meyers; Mielke; H. Myers; Riley; Scott; D. Sommers; Tate; Vance; and Wineberry.

Background: The minimum number of district court judges in each county is set by statute. Periodically, these numbers are adjusted to reflect shifts in population and caseloads.

Summary of Bill: The minimum numbers of district court judges in three counties are increased as follows:

- o King County from 24 to 26;
- o Pierce County from 8 to 11; and
- o Spokane County from 8 to 9.

EFFECT OF SENATE AMENDMENT(S): The amendment reduces from three to two the minimum number of district court judges in Pacific County.

Fiscal Note: Not requested.

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

**Testimony For:** The workload for the district courts in these counties justifies the additional judges.

Testimony Against: None.
