### BACKGROUND:

A port district that operates an airport serving more than 20 scheduled jet aircraft flights per day may establish a program of aircraft noise abatement. Among other items, the aircraft noise abatement program may include purchasing property and soundproofing structures. When a port district soundproofs a structure under this program a property owner must waive <u>all</u> damages and convey a <u>full and unrestricted</u> easement to the port district for the operation of aircraft and associated aircraft noise.

## SUMMARY:

The requirements for owner participation in a port noise abatement program are reduced. Owners are not required to waive <u>all</u> claims and the easement granted does not need to be <u>total and unrestricted</u>.
