1 AN ACT Relating to historical activities; creating a new section; 2 and making an appropriation.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes that 5 providing funding for the preservation of historic landmarks is a 6 substantial and compelling interest of the state. The Georgetown steam 7 plant, built in 1906, has been designated a national historic landmark. The Friends of the Georgetown steam plant seek to open it to the public 8 The electrek museum will not only benefit the 9 as the electrek museum. 10 Georgetown area economically, but will also serve as an educational 11 tool allowing all citizens, especially school-age children, to better 12 understand many of the underlying principles of modern technology. The legislature further recognizes the need to provide the Friends of the 13

Georgetown steam plant a state-funded grant to allow them to open the
electrek museum.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. The sum of one hundred fifty thousand 4 dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for 5 the biennium ending June 30, 1993, from the general fund to the 6 department of community development for the purposes of assisting the 7 Friends of the Georgetown steam plant.
