## HOUSE BILL 1086

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the uniform status of children of assisted
- 2 conception act; adding a new chapter to Title 26 RCW; and creating a
- 3 new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter:
- 6 (1) "Assisted conception" means a pregnancy resulting from
- 7 insemination of an egg of a woman with sperm of a man: (a) By means
- 8 other than sexual intercourse; or (b) by removal and implantation of an
- 9 embryo after sexual intercourse; but does not include the pregnancy of
- 10 a wife resulting from the insemination of her egg using her husband's
- 11 sperm.
- 12 (2) "Donor" means an individual whose body produces sperm or egg
- 13 used for the purpose of assisted conception, whether or not a payment

- 1 is made for the sperm or egg used, but does not include a woman who
- 2 gives birth to a resulting child.
- 3 (3) "Surrogate" means an adult woman who enters into an agreement
- 4 to bear a child conceived through assisted conception for intended
- 5 parents.
- 6 (4) "Child" includes children.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** MATERNITY. A woman who gives birth to a
- 8 child is the child's mother.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** ASSISTED CONCEPTION BY MARRIED WOMAN. The
- 10 husband of a woman who bears a child through assisted conception is the
- 11 father of the child, notwithstanding any declaration of invalidity or
- 12 annulment of the marriage obtained after the assisted conception,
- 13 unless within two years after learning of the child's birth he
- 14 commences an action in which the mother and child are parties and in
- 15 which it is determined that he did not consent to the assisted
- 16 conception.
- 17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** PARENTAL STATUS OF DONORS AND DECEASED
- 18 PERSONS. (1) A donor is not the parent of a child conceived through
- 19 assisted conception.
- 20 (2) A person who dies before a conception using his sperm or her
- 21 egg is not a parent of any resulting child born of the conception.
- 22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** SURROGATE AGREEMENTS. Any agreement in
- 23 which a woman agrees to become a surrogate or to relinquish her rights
- 24 and duties as parent of a child conceived through assisted conception
- 25 is void. The surrogate, however, is the mother of a resulting child
- 26 and the surrogate's husband, if a party to the agreement, is the father

- 1 of the child. If the surrogate's husband is not a party to the
- 2 agreement or the surrogate is unmarried, paternity of the child is
- 3 governed by chapter 26.26 RCW, the uniform parentage act.
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. RELATION OF PARENT AND CHILD. A child whose
- 5 status as a child is declared or negated by this chapter is the child
- 6 only of his or her parent or parents as determined under this chapter
- 7 for all purposes including but not limited to succession and gift
- 8 rights in section 7 of this act.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** SUCCESSION AND GIFT RIGHTS. Unless
- 10 superseded by later events forming or terminating a parent and child
- 11 relationship, the status of parent and child declared or negated by
- 12 this chapter as to a given individual and a child born alive controls
- 13 for purposes of:
- 14 (1) Intestate succession;
- 15 (2) Probate law exemptions, allowances, or other protections for
- 16 children in a parent's estate; and
- 17 (3) Determining eligibility of the child or the child's descendants
- 18 to share in a donative transfer from any person as a member of a class
- 19 determined by reference to the relationship.
- 20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** UNIFORMITY OF APPLICATION AND CONSTRUCTION.
- 21 This chapter shall be applied and construed to effectuate its general
- 22 purpose to make uniform the law with respect to the subject of this
- 23 chapter among states enacting it.
- 24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** PROSPECTIVE APPLICATION. This chapter
- 25 applies prospectively only and not retroactively.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 10.** SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as
- 2 the uniform status of children of assisted conception act.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 11.** If any provision of this act or its
- 4 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 5 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 6 persons or circumstances is not affected.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 12.** Section headings as used in this act do not
- 8 constitute any part of the law.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 13.** Sections 1 through 10 of this act shall
- 10 constitute a new chapter in Title 26 RCW.
