1 AN ACT Relating to transportation appropriations; making 2 appropriations; providing an effective date; and declaring an 3 emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

Authority to expend any funds for individual information systems 15 16 projects shall be conditioned upon approval of the relevant feasibility 17 study and project management plan by the department of information 18 services and the office of financial management or the legislative 19 transportation committee as appropriate.
