ENGROSSED SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1310

AN ACT Relating to voter registration by mail; amending RCW 2 29.10.180; adding a new chapter to Title 29 RCW; repealing RCW 3 29.07.040; prescribing penalties; and providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. Unless the context clearly requires 6 otherwise, "by mail" means delivery of a completed original voter 7 registration form by mail, by personal delivery, or by courier to a 8 county auditor.

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. The county auditor is responsible for 10 the conduct of voter registration under this chapter within the county. 11 Except where inconsistent with this chapter, the remaining provisions 12 of Title 29 RCW apply to registration by mail.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. Any elector of this state may register
 to vote by mail under this chapter.

The county auditor shall distribute 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. forms by which a person may register to vote by mail and cancel any 4 5 previous registration in this state. The county auditor shall keep a supply of voter registration forms in his or her office at all times 6 for political parties and others interested in assisting in voter 7 8 registration, and shall make every effort to make these forms generally 9 available to the public. The county auditor shall provide voter 10 registration forms to city and town clerks, state offices, schools, fire stations, and any other locations considered appropriate by the 11 auditor for extending registration opportunities to all areas of the 12 13 county. After the initial distribution of voter registration forms to a given location, a representative designated by the official in charge 14 of that location shall notify the county auditor of the need for 15 16 additional voter registration supplies.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. In addition to the information required 18 under RCW 29.07.070, when registering to vote by mail under this 19 chapter, the applicant shall provide his or her driver's license number 20 from a valid Washington state driver's license.

If the applicant does not have a valid Washington state driver's license, then the applicant shall provide his or her social security number.

If the applicant does not have a valid Washington state driver's license or a social security number, then the applicant shall provide the number from his or her valid Washington state identicard.

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1 If the applicant does not provide the information required in this 2 section, the county auditor shall not process the form until the 3 information is provided.

4 The applicant shall sign a portion of the form that can be used as initiative signature card for the verification of petition 5 an б signatures by the secretary of state and shall sign and attest to the following oath: "I declare that the facts relating to my 7 qualifications as a voter recorded on this voter registration form are 8 9 true. I am a citizen of the United States, I am not presently denied my civil rights as a result of being convicted of an infamous crime, I 10 will have lived in this state, county, and precinct thirty days 11 immediately preceding the next election at which I offer to vote, and 12 I will be at least eighteen years of age at the time of voting." 13

The voter registration by mail form shall provide, in a conspicuous place, the following warning: "Knowingly providing false information on this voter registration form or knowingly making a false declaration about your qualifications for registration is a class C felony punishable by imprisonment for up to five years, or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars, or by both such imprisonment and fine."

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. A person qualified to vote who wishes to 21 register to vote, but who cannot provide the information required under 22 section 5 of this act, may register in person under chapter 29.07 RCW.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. On receipt of an application for voter 24 registration under this chapter, the county auditor shall review the 25 application to determine whether the information supplied is complete. 26 If it is not, the auditor shall promptly send notice of the deficiency 27 to the applicant. If the information is complete, the applicant is 28 registered as of the date of the application's postmark. If there is

no postmark or if the postmark is illegible, the applicant is 1 2 registered on the date the complete and correct application was received by the auditor. The auditor shall record the appropriate 3 4 precinct identification, taxing district identification, and date of registration on the voter's record. Within forty-five days after the 5 6 receipt of an application but no later than seven days before the next primary, special election, or general election, the auditor shall send 7 to the applicant, by first class mail, a voter registration card 8 9 identifying the registrant's precinct and containing such other 10 information as may be required by the secretary of state. The postal service shall be instructed not to forward a voter registration card to 11 any other address and to return to the auditor any card which is not 12 13 deliverable.

14 If a voter registration card is properly mailed as required by this section to the address listed by the applicant as being the applicant's 15 mailing address and the card is subsequently returned to the auditor by 16 17 the postal service as being undeliverable to the applicant at that address, the voter registration of the applicant shall be immediately 18 19 canceled. The auditor shall promptly send the applicant a notice and 20 explanation of the cancellation, and a registration application form. The postal service shall be requested to forward this notice as 21 22 applicable.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. Ninety days prior to a general election, 24 the county auditor shall sample ten percent of the mail-in applications 25 for voter registration received following the previous general 26 election. If ten percent or more of the applications sampled are found 27 to be either fraudulent or inaccurate, the county auditor shall audit 28 all mail-in applications received during that period.

1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 9. The secretary of state shall adopt an 2 application form for registering by mail under RCW 29.07.140. An applicant registering to vote by mail shall be required to complete 3 4 only one form and to provide the required information, other than his or her signature, no more than once. The form shall also contain 5 б instructions on its use, a notification of filing deadlines, a warning to the applicant of the penalty for knowingly supplying false 7 information, and space for the county auditor to enter the voter's 8 9 precinct identification, taxing district identification, and 10 registration number. The secretary of state shall develop the forms in consultation with the county auditors. 11

12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 10. The secretary of state shall furnish 13 registration forms necessary to carry out the registration of voters as 14 provided by this chapter without cost to the respective counties.

15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 11. Violations of this chapter shall be 16 prosecuted under chapter 29.85 RCW or any other applicable provisions 17 of law.

18 Sec. 12. RCW 29.10.180 and 1991 c 363 s 31 are each amended to 19 read as follows:

(1) The county auditor may enter one or more contracts with the United States postal service, or its licensee, which permit the auditor to use postal service change-of-address information. If the auditor finds that information received under such a contract gives the appearance that a voter has changed his or her residence address, the auditor shall notify the voter concerning the requirements of state and federal laws governing voter registration and residence.

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(2) Whenever any vote-by-mail ballot, notification to voters 1 2 following reprecincting of the county, notification to voters of selection to serve on jury duty, notification under subsection (1) of 3 4 this section, or ((initial)) voter identification card other than a voter identification card issued under section 7 of this act is 5 б returned by the postal service as undeliverable, the county auditor shall, in every instance, inquire into the validity of the registration 7 of that voter. 8

9 (3) The county auditor shall initiate his or her inquiry by 10 sending, by first-class mail, a written notice to the challenged voter at the address indicated on the voter's permanent registration record 11 and to any other address at which the county auditor could reasonably 12 expect mail to be received by the voter. The county auditor shall not 13 14 request any restriction on the forwarding of such notice by the postal 15 The notice shall contain the nature of the inquiry and service. provide a suitable form for reply. The notice shall also contain a 16 17 warning that the county auditor must receive a response within forty-18 five days from the date of mailing or the individual's voter 19 registration will be canceled.

20 (4) The voter, in person or in writing, may state that the 21 information on the permanent voter registration record is correct or 22 may request a change in the address information on the permanent 23 registration record no later than the forty-fifth day after the date of 24 mailing the inquiry.

(5) Upon the timely receipt of a response signed by the voter, the county auditor shall consider the inquiry satisfied and will make any address corrections requested by the voter on the permanent registration record. The county auditor shall cancel the registration of a voter who fails to respond to the notice of inquiry within fortyfive days after the date of mailing.

1 (6) The county auditor shall notify any voter whose registration 2 has been canceled by sending, by first class mail, a written notice to 3 the address indicated on the voter's permanent registration record and 4 to any other address to which the original inquiry was sent. Upon 5 receipt of a satisfactory voter response, the auditor shall reinstate 6 the voter.

7 (7) A voter whose registration has been canceled under this section and who offers to vote at the next ensuing election shall be issued a 8 9 questioned ballot. Upon receipt of such a questioned ballot the 10 auditor shall investigate the circumstances surrounding the original 11 cancellation. If he or she determines that the cancellation was in error, the voter's registration shall be immediately reinstated, and 12 the voter's questioned ballot shall be counted. If the original 13 14 cancellation was not in error, the voter shall be afforded the 15 opportunity to reregister at his or her correct address, and the voter's questioned ballot shall not be counted. 16

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 13. Sections 1 through 11 of this act shall
18 constitute a new chapter in Title 29 RCW.

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 14. RCW 29.07.040 and 1971 ex.s. c 202 s 6 20 & 1965 c 9 s 29.07.040 are each repealed.

21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 15. Sections 1 through 11 and 14 of this act 22 take effect on January 1, 1993.
