- 1 AN ACT Relating to community involvement in stopping crime through
- 2 creation of a Crime Stoppers assistance office; creating new sections;
- 3 making an appropriation; and providing an expiration date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) The attorney general shall establish
- 6 a Crime Stoppers assistance office to work in conjunction with local
- 7 Crime Stoppers organizations, sheriffs, and police chiefs to design
- 8 model Crime Stoppers programs and provide training and assistance to
- 9 local Crime Stoppers efforts.
- 10 (2) The Crime Stoppers assistance office may distribute
- 11 appropriated funds in the form of grants to law enforcement agencies or
- 12 local jurisdictions with qualified Crime Stoppers programs as follows:
- 13 (a) The Crime Stoppers assistance office may accept applications
- 14 for grants from law enforcement agencies or local jurisdictions with
- 15 Crime Stoppers programs identical or similar to the model programs or

- 1 from law enforcement agencies or local jurisdictions wishing to start
- 2 such programs.
- 3 (b) The Crime Stoppers assistance office will determine what
- 4 matching resources, if any, should be required from those Crime
- 5 Stoppers programs seeking grants.
- 6 (c) At least twenty-five percent of the grants given in any
- 7 biennium must be for training, public awareness efforts, and
- 8 establishing new programs.
- 9 (d) Grants awarded to local jurisdictions shall be used for
- 10 operating costs of Crime Stoppers programs, and may not be used for
- 11 rewards.
- 12 (e) Law enforcement agencies or local jurisdictions may not receive
- 13 more than one grant under section 4 of this act. The grant may be
- 14 awarded either to start a Crime Stoppers program or to expand an
- 15 existing Crime Stoppers program but not both.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The attorney general shall appoint an
- 17 advisory council to periodically review the Crime Stoppers program and
- 18 report to the legislature, not later than January 1 of each year, on
- 19 the program's administration and its progress in achieving its
- 20 objectives.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The attorney general may adopt rules as
- 22 are necessary to achieve the goals of this program.
- 23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The sum of four hundred thousand
- 24 dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for
- 25 the biennium ending June 30, 1993, to the attorney general from the
- 26 general fund, to effect the purposes of this act.

1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** This act shall expire on June 30, 1993.
