- 1 AN ACT Relating to maintaining the Washington state patrol crime
- 2 laboratory system; amending RCW 43.43.670; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.43.670 and 1980 c 69 s 2 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 There is created in the Washington state patrol a crime laboratory
- 7 system which is authorized to:
- 8 (1) Provide laboratory services for the purpose of analyzing and
- 9 scientifically handling any physical evidence relating to any crime.
- 10 (2) Provide training assistance for local law enforcement
- 11 personnel.
- 12 The crime laboratory system shall assign priority to a request for
- 13 services with due regard to whether the case involves criminal activity
- 14 against persons. The Washington state advisory council on criminal
- 15 justice services shall assist the crime laboratory system in devising

- 1 policies to promote the most efficient use of laboratory resources
- 2 consistent with this section.
- 3 The Washington state patrol shall maintain crime laboratories in at
- 4 <u>least the same locations as it did as of December 31, 1990, and shall</u>
- 5 provide services at each of those locations at at least the same level
- 6 <u>as it did as of December 31, 1990.</u>
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 8 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 9 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 10 effect immediately.
