
ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 2061

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the state energy code for nonresidential
- 2 buildings; and adding a new section to chapter 19.27A RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 19.27A RCW
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) The Washington state energy code, 1986 edition, is the minimum
- 7 state energy code for nonresidential buildings. The state building
- 8 code council may, by rule adopted pursuant to chapter 34.05 RCW, amend
- 9 that code's requirements for nonresidential buildings if:
- 10 (a) The amendments increase the energy efficiency of typical newly
- 11 constructed nonresidential buildings; and
- 12 (b) Any new measures, standards, or requirements adopted are
- 13 technically feasible, commercially available, and cost-effective to
- 14 building owners and tenants.

- 1 (2) In considering amendments to the state energy code for
- 2 nonresidential buildings, the state building code council shall
- 3 establish and consult with a technical advisory committee including
- 4 representatives of appropriate state agencies, local governments,
- 5 general contractors, building owners and managers, building code
- 6 enforcement officials, design professionals, utilities, and other
- 7 interested and affected parties.
- 8 (3) Decisions to amend the Washington state energy code for
- 9 nonresidential buildings shall be made prior to December 31 of a year
- 10 and shall not take effect before the end of the regular legislative
- 11 session in the next year. Substantial amendments to the code shall be
- 12 adopted no more frequently than every three years.
