1 AN ACT Relating to unsolicited goods, wares, merchandise, and 2 services; amending RCW 19.56.020; and declaring an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 19.56.020 and 1967 c 57 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 ((Unless otherwise agreed, where)) Any person who receives 7 unsolicited goods ((are mailed to a person, he)), wares, merchandise, or services, offered for sale, but not actually ordered or requested by 8 9 that person orally or in writing, has a right to accept delivery of 10 ((such)) those goods, wares, merchandise, or services as ((a)) an 11 <u>unconditional</u> gift ((only)), and is not bound to return ((such)) <u>those</u> goods, wares, or merchandise to the sender, or to pay for the services. 12 ((If such)) A person who receives unsolicited goods ((are either 13 14 addressed to or intended for the recipient, he)), wares, merchandise, 15 or services may use them or dispose of them in any manner without any

obligation to the sender((, and)) or provider. In any action for 1 2 goods, wares, merchandise, or services sold and delivered, or in any action for the return of the goods, wares, or merchandise, or in any 3 action for the compensation for services, it shall be a complete 4 defense that the goods, wares, merchandise, or services were ((mailed)) 5 6 delivered or provided voluntarily and that the defendant did not actually order or request ((such)) those goods, wares, merchandise, or 7 services, either orally or in writing. 8

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. If any provision of this act or its 10 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 11 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 12 persons or circumstances is not affected.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate 14 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 15 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take 16 effect immediately.

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
