1 AN ACT Relating to the advisory committee of the department of
2 veterans affairs; and amending RCW 43.60A.080.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.60A.080 and 1987 c 59 s 1 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 (1) There is hereby created a ((state)) veterans affairs advisory
7 committee which shall serve in an advisory capacity to the governor and
8 the director of the department of veterans affairs. The committee
9 shall be composed of ((fifteen)) seventeen members to be appointed by
10 the governor, and shall consist of ((two veterans at large, one of whom
11 shall be a Vietnam era veteran; one representative of the Washington
12 soldiers' home and colony at Orting; one representative of the
13 Washington veterans' home at Retsil; and one representative of each of
14 the following congressionally chartered veterans organizations:

1 American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Veterans of World
2 War II, Korea and Vietnam, Disabled American Veterans, Military Order
3 of the Purple Heart, Marine Corps League, Paralyzed Veterans of
4 America, Incorporated, American Ex-prisoners of War, Veterans of World
5 War I, Gold Star Mothers, and the Vietnam Veterans of America,
6 Incorporated. The eleven members representing each of the foregoing
7 organizations shall each be chosen from three names submitted to the
8 governor by each of the named organizations. The first members of the
9 committee shall hold office as follows: Three members to serve two
10 years; three members to serve three years; and three members to serve
11 four years. The first members appointed to represent the soldiers'
12 home and colony at Orting and the veterans' home at Retsil shall hold
13 office for four years. Upon expiration of said original terms,
14 subsequent appointments shall be for four years except in the case of
15 a vacancy, in which event appointment shall be only for the remainder
16 of the unexpired term for which the vacancy occurs. No member shall
17 serve more than two consecutive terms.

18 (2)) the following:

19 (a) One representative of the Washington soldiers' home and colony
20 at Orting and one representative of the Washington veterans' home at
21 Retsil. Each home's residents council may nominate up to three
22 individuals whose names are to be forwarded by the director to the
23 governor. In making the appointments, the governor shall consider
24 these recommendations and may request additional nominations.

25 (b) One representative each from the three congressionally
26 chartered veterans organizations with the largest number of active
27 members in the state of Washington as determined by the director. The
28 organizations' state commanders may each submit a list of three names
29 to be forwarded to the governor by the director. In making the

1 appointments, the governor shall consider these recommendations and may
2 request additional nominations.

3 (c) Ten members shall be chosen to represent those congressionally
4 chartered veterans organizations having at least one active chapter
5 within the state of Washington. Up to three nominations may be
6 forwarded from each organization to the governor by the director. In
7 making the appointments, the governor shall consider these
8 recommendations and may request additional nominations.

9 (d) Two members shall be veterans at large. Any individual or
10 organization may nominate a veteran for an at-large position.
11 Organizational affiliation shall not be a prerequisite for nomination
12 or appointment. Nominations for the at-large positions shall be
13 forwarded by the director to the governor.

14 (e) No organization shall have more than one official
15 representative on the committee at any one time.

16 (f) In making appointments to the committee, care shall be taken to
17 ensure that members represent the geographical portions of the state
18 and minority viewpoints, and that the issues and views of concern to
19 women veterans are represented.

20 (2) All members shall have terms of four years. In the case of a
21 vacancy, appointment shall be only for the remainder of the unexpired
22 term for which the vacancy occurs. No member may serve more than two
23 consecutive terms, with vacancy appointments to an unexpired term not
24 considered as a term. Members appointed before the effective date of
25 this act shall continue to serve until the expiration of their current
26 terms; and then, subject to the conditions contained in this section,
27 are eligible for reappointment.

28 (3) The committee shall adopt an order of business for conducting
29 its meetings.

1 (4) The (~~state advisory~~) committee shall have the following
2 powers and duties:

3 (a) To serve in an advisory capacity to the governor and the
4 director on (~~all~~) matters pertaining to the department of veterans
5 affairs;

6 (b) To acquaint themselves fully with the operations of the
7 department and recommend such changes to the governor and the director
8 as they deem advisable.

9 (~~(3)~~) (5) Members of the (~~state advisory~~) committee shall
10 receive no compensation for the performance of their duties but shall
11 receive a per diem allowance and mileage expense according to the
12 provisions of chapter 43.03 RCW.
