
SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2548

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1992 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to education; amending RCW 28A.150.410; and
2 creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.150.410 and 1990 c 33 s 118 are each amended to
5 read as follows:

6 (1) The legislature shall establish for each school year in the
7 appropriations act a state-wide salary allocation schedule, for
8 allocation purposes only, to be used to distribute funds for basic
9 education certificated instructional staff salaries under RCW
10 28A.150.260.

11 (2) The superintendent of public instruction shall calculate salary
12 allocations for state funded basic education certificated instructional
13 staff by determining the district average salary for basic education
14 instructional staff using the salary allocation schedule established

1 pursuant to this section. However, no district shall receive an
2 allocation based upon an average basic education certificated
3 instructional staff salary which is less than the average of the
4 district's 1986-87 actual basic education certificated instructional
5 staff salaries, as reported to the superintendent of public instruction
6 prior to June 1, 1987, and the legislature may grant minimum salary
7 increases on that base: PROVIDED, That the superintendent of public
8 instruction may adjust this allocation based upon the education and
9 experience of the district's certificated instructional staff.
10 Beginning in the 1992-93 school year, the determination of years of
11 service for licensed occupational therapists, physical therapists, and
12 nurses shall include experience in schools and also experience in other
13 nonschool positions as licensed occupational therapists, physical
14 therapists, and/or nurses.

15 (3) Beginning January 1, 1992, no more than ninety college quarter-
16 hour credits received by any employee after the baccalaureate degree
17 may be used to determine compensation allocations under the state
18 salary allocation schedule and LEAP documents referenced in the
19 biennial appropriations act, or any replacement schedules and
20 documents, unless:

21 (a) The employee has a masters degree; or

22 (b) The credits were used in generating state salary allocations
23 before January 1, 1992.

24 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. If specific funding for the purposes of
25 this act, referencing this act by bill number, is not provided by June
26 30, 1992, in the supplemental biennial operating appropriations act,
27 this act shall be null and void.
