AN ACT Relating to the litter assessment; amending RCW 70.93.010, 70.93.020, 70.93.120, 70.93.130, 70.93.140, 70.93.160, 70.93.170, and 70.93.180; adding a new chapter to Title 82 RCW; recodifying RCW 70.93.120, 70.93.130, 70.93.140, 70.93.160, and 70.93.170; repealing RCW 70.93.150 and 70.93.194; and providing an effective date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 Sec. 1. RCW 70.93.010 and 1979 c 94 s 1 are each amended to read 8 as follows:

9 ((Recognizing the rapid population growth of the state of 10 Washington and the ever increasing mobility of its people, as well as 11 the fundamental need for a healthful, clean and beautiful environment; 12 and further recognizing that the proliferation and accumulation of 13 litter discarded throughout this state impairs this need and 14 constitutes a public health hazard; and further recognizing the need to 1 conserve energy and natural resources; and further recognizing that 2 there is an imperative need to anticipate, plan for, and accomplish 3 effective litter control and recover and recycle waste materials 4 related to litter with the subsequent conservation of resources and 5 energy, there is hereby enacted this)) (1) The legislature finds:

6 (a) Washington state is experiencing rapid population growth and
7 its citizens are increasingly mobile;

8 (b) There is a fundamental need for a healthful, clean, and 9 <u>beautiful environment;</u>

10 (c) The proliferation and accumulation of litter discarded 11 throughout this state impairs this need and constitutes a public health 12 hazard;

13 (d) There is a need to conserve energy and natural resources, and 14 the effective litter control and recovery and recycling of litter 15 materials will serve to accomplish such conservation;

16 (e) In addition to effective litter control, there must be 17 effective programs to accomplish waste reduction, the state's highest 18 waste management priority; and

19 (f) There must also be effective systems to accomplish all 20 components of recycling, including collection, processing, and the 21 marketing of recyclable materials and recycled content products.

22 (2) Recognizing the multifaceted nature of the state's solid waste 23 management problems, the legislation enacted in 1971 and entitled the 24 "Model Litter Control and Recycling Act"((-)) is hereby renamed the 25 <u>"waste reduction, recycling, and model litter control act."</u>

26 **Sec. 2.** RCW 70.93.020 and 1991 c 319 s 101 are each amended to 27 read as follows:

28 The purpose of this chapter is to accomplish litter control, 29 <u>increase waste reduction</u>, and stimulate ((<del>private</del>)) <u>all components of</u> HB 2635 p. 2 of 8 1 recycling ((programs)) throughout this state by delegating to the 2 department of ecology the authority to:

3 (1) Conduct a permanent and continuous program to control and 4 remove litter from this state to the maximum practical extent possible; 5 (2) Recover and recycle waste materials related to litter and 6 littering;

7 (3) Foster private recycling and markets for recyclable materials; 8 ((and))

9 (4) Increase public awareness of the need for recycling and litter 10 control<u>;</u>

11 (5) Promote and administer programs for waste reduction, including 12 reduction of packaging waste; and

13 (6) Enforce environmental labelling standards.

14 It is further the intent and purpose of this chapter to create jobs for employment of youth in litter cleanup and related activities and to 15 stimulate and encourage small, private recycling centers. This program 16 17 shall include the compatible goal of recovery of recyclable materials to conserve energy and natural resources wherever practicable. Every 18 19 other department of state government and all local governmental units 20 and agencies of this state shall cooperate with the department of ecology in the administration and enforcement of this chapter. 21 The intent of this chapter is to add to and to coordinate existing 22 recycling and litter control and removal efforts and not terminate or 23 24 supplant such efforts.

25 Sec. 3. RCW 70.93.120 and 1971 ex.s. c 307 s 12 are each amended 26 to read as follows:

In addition to any other taxes, there is hereby levied and there shall be collected by the department of revenue from every person <u>for</u> <u>the privilege of</u> engaging within this state in business as a

manufacturer ((and/or making sales at wholesale and/or making sales at 1 2 retail)), as a wholesaler, or as a retailer, an annual litter ((assessment)) tax equal to the value of products listed in RCW 82.--.-3 -- (RCW 70.93.130 as recodified by section 10 of this act), including 4 byproducts, manufactured ((and sold)) within this state((, including 5 б by-products)), multiplied by ((one and one-half hundredths)) fifteen one-thousandths of one percent in the case of manufacturers, and equal 7 to the gross proceeds of ((the)) sales of the ((business)) products 8 9 listed in RCW 82.--.-- (RCW 70.93.130 as recodified by section 10 of 10 this act) that are sold within this state multiplied by ((one and onehalf hundredths)) fifteen one-thousandths of one percent in the case of 11 12 ((sales at wholesale and/or at retail)) wholesalers and retailers.

13 Sec. 4. RCW 70.93.130 and 1971 ex.s. c 307 s 13 are each amended 14 to read as follows:

15 ((Because it is the express purpose of this chapter)) To accomplish 16 effective litter control within the state ((of Washington)) and ((because it is a further purpose of this chapter)) to allocate a 17 18 portion of the cost of administering ((it)) this chapter to those 19 industries whose products, including the packages, wrappings, and containers thereof, are reasonably related to the litter problem, ((in 20 21 arriving at the amount upon which the assessment is to be calculated)) 22 the tax imposed in this chapter shall only apply to the value of 23 products or the gross proceeds of sales of products falling into the 24 following categories ((shall be included)):

25 (1) Food for human or pet consumption.

26 (2) Groceries.

- 27 (3) Cigarettes and tobacco products.
- 28 (4) Soft drinks and carbonated waters.
- 29 (5) Beer and other malt beverages.

- 1 (6) Wine.
- 2 (7) Newspapers and magazines.
- 3 (8) Household paper and paper products.
- 4 (9) Glass containers.
- 5 (10) Metal containers.
- 6 (11) Plastic or fiber containers made of synthetic material.
- 7 (12) Cleaning agents and toiletries.
- 8 (13) Nondrug drugstore sundry products.
- 9 <u>(14) Textiles.</u>
- 10 <u>(15) Automotive parts.</u>
- 11 (16) Business paper and paper products.
- 12 <u>(17) Building materials.</u>

13 Sec. 5. RCW 70.93.140 and 1971 ex.s. c 307 s 14 are each amended 14 to read as follows:

15 (1) The department of revenue, by rule ((and regulation made pursuant to chapter 34.05 RCW)), may, if such is required, define ((the categories (1) through (13) as set forth in)) those items subject to tax under RCW 82.--.-- (RCW 70.93.130 as recodified by section 10 of this act). In making any such definitions, the department of revenue shall be guided by the following standards:

21 (((1))) <u>(a)</u> It is the purpose of this chapter to accomplish 22 effective control of litter within this state;

(((2))) (b) It is the purpose of this chapter to allocate a portion of the cost of administration of this chapter to those industries manufacturing and/or selling products and the packages, wrappings, or containers thereof which are reasonably related to the litter problem within this state.

(2) Instead of requiring each business to separately account for
 taxable and nontaxable products under this chapter, the department

shall provide, by rule, that the tax imposed in this chapter be
 reported and paid based on a percentage of total sales for a particular
 type of business if the department determines that the percentage
 reasonably approximates the taxable activity of the particular type of
 business.

6 Sec. 6. RCW 70.93.160 and 1971 ex.s. c 307 s 16 are each amended 7 to read as follows:

8 (1) To the extent applicable, all of the provisions of chapters 9 82.04 and 82.32 RCW ((such as they apply are incorporated herein)) 10 apply to the tax imposed in this chapter, except RCW 82.04.220 through 11 82.04.290, and 82.04.330.

12 (2) Taxes collected under this chapter shall be deposited in the 13 waste reduction, recycling, and litter control account under RCW 14 70.93.180.

15 Sec. 7. RCW 70.93.170 and 1971 ex.s. c 307 s 17 are each amended 16 to read as follows:

17 The litter ((assessment herein provided for shall not be applied)) 18 tax imposed in this chapter does not apply to:

19 <u>(1) The manufacture or sale of products for use and consumption</u> 20 <u>outside the state; or</u>

21 (2) The value of products or gross proceeds of the sales of any 22 animal, bird, or insect or the milk, eggs, wool, fur, meat, honey, or 23 other substance obtained therefrom, if the person performs only the 24 growing or raising function of such animal, bird, or insect. ((In all 25 other instances, the assessment shall be applied.))

26 **Sec. 8.** RCW 70.93.180 and 1991 sp.s. c 13 s 40 are each amended to 27 read as follows:

(1) There is hereby created an account within the state treasury to 1 2 be known as the "waste reduction, recycling, and litter control 3 account". Moneys in the account may be spent only after appropriation. Expenditures from the waste reduction, recycling, and litter control 4 account may only be used for programs to: 5 6 (a) Control litter; 7 (b) Encourage recycling; (c) Develop markets for recyclable materials; 8 9 (d) Reduce waste; (e) Enforce environmental advertising standards; and 10 (f) Enforce compliance with the litter assessment levied pursuant 11 to RCW 70.93.120. 12 (2) All ((assessments,)) taxes imposed in RCW 82.--.-- (RCW 13 14 70.93.120 as recodified under section 10 of this act) and fines( $(\tau)$ ) 15 and bail forfeitures((, and other funds)) collected or received pursuant to this chapter shall be deposited in the waste reduction, 16 17 recycling, and litter control account and used for ((the administration and implementation of this chapter)) the programs under subsection (1) 18 19 of this section, and except as required to be otherwise distributed 20 under RCW 70.93.070.

21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 9. The following acts or parts of acts are
22 each repealed:

23 (1) RCW 70.93.150 and 1971 ex.s. c 307 s 15; and

24 (2) RCW 70.93.194 and 1979 c 94 s 9.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 10. RCW 70.93.120, 70.93.130, 70.93.140,
 70.93.160, and 70.93.170 shall be recodified as a new chapter in Title
 82 RCW.
