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## ENGROSSED SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2769

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1992 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to changes in the telecommunications relay service;
- 2 and amending RCW 43.20A.720, 43.20A.725, and 43.20A.730.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 43.20A.720 and 1990 c 89 s 2 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 "Hearing impaired" means those persons who are certified to be
- 7 deaf, deaf-blind, or hard of hearing, and those persons who are
- 8 certified to have a hearing disability limiting their access to
- 9 telecommunications.
- 10 "Speech impaired" means persons who are certified to be unable to
- 11 speak or who are certified to have a speech impairment limiting their
- 12 access to telecommunications.
- "Text telephone (TT)," formerly known as a telecommunications
- 14 device for the deaf (TDD)((")) means a ((teletypewriter))

- 1 <u>telcommunications device</u> that has a typewriter <u>or computer</u> keyboard and
- 2 a readable display that couples with the telephone, allowing messages
- 3 to be typed rather than spoken. The device allows a person to make a
- 4 telephone call directly to another person possessing similar equipment.
- 5 The conversation is typed through one machine to the other machine
- 6 instead of spoken.
- 7 "((TDD)) <u>Telecommunications</u> relay ((<del>system</del>)) <u>service (TRS)</u>" is a
- 8 service for hearing and speech impaired people who have a ((TDD)) TT to
- 9 call someone who does not have a ((TDD)) TT or vice versa. The service
- 10 consists of several telephones being utilized by ((TDD relay service
- 11 operators)) TRS communications assistants who receive either ((TDD)) TT
- 12 or voice phone calls. If a ((TDD relay service operator)) TRS
- 13 <u>communications assistant</u> receives a phone call from a hearing or speech
- 14 impaired person wishing to call a hearing person, the operator will
- 15 call the hearing person and act as an intermediary by translating what
- 16 is displayed on the ((TDD))  $\underline{TT}$  to voice and typing what is voiced into
- 17 the ((TDD)) TT to be read by the hearing or speech impaired caller.
- 18 This process can also be reversed with a hearing person calling a deaf
- 19 person through the ((TDD)) <u>telecommunications</u> relay service. <u>"TRS</u>
- 20 program" as used in this chapter includes both the relay function and
- 21 TTs.
- 22 "Qualified trainer" is a person who is knowledgeable about ((<del>TDDs</del>))
- 23 TTs, signal devices, and amplifying accessories; familiar with the
- 24 technical aspects of equipment designed to meet hearing impaired
- 25 people's needs; and is fluent in American sign language.
- 26 "Qualified contractor" shall have ((bilingual)) staff bilingual in
- 27 American sign language and standard English available for quality
- 28 language/cultural interpretations; quality training of operators; and
- 29 policies, training, and operational procedures to be determined by the
- 30 office.

- 1 "The department" means the department of social and health services
- 2 of the state of Washington.
- 3 "Office" means the office of deaf services within the state
- 4 department of social and health services.
- 5 Sec. 2. RCW 43.20A.725 and 1990 c 89 s 3 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 (1) The department shall maintain a program whereby ((TDDs)) TTs,
- 8 signal devices, a ((TDD relay system)) TRS, and amplifying accessories
- 9 capable of serving the needs of the hearing and speech impaired shall
- 10 be provided at no charge additional to the basic exchange rate, to an
- 11 individual of school age or older, (a) who is certified as hearing
- 12 impaired by a licensed physician, audiologist, or a qualified state
- 13 agency, and to any subscriber that is an organization representing or
- 14 serving the hearing impaired, as determined and specified by the
- 15 ((TDD)) TRS program advisory committee; or (b) who is certified as
- 16 speech impaired by a licensed physician, speech pathologist, or a
- 17 qualified state agency, and to any subscriber that is an organization
- 18 representing the speech impaired, as determined and specified by the
- 19 ((TDD)) TRS program advisory committee. For the purpose of this
- 20 section, certification implies that individuals cannot use the
- 21 telephone for expressive or receptive communications due to hearing or
- 22 speech impairment.
- 23 (2) The office shall award contracts on a competitive basis, to
- 24 qualified persons for which eligibility to contract is determined by
- 25 the office, for the distribution and maintenance of such ((TDDs)) TTs,
- 26 signal devices, and amplifying accessories as shall be determined by
- 27 the office. Such contract shall include a provision for the employment
- 28 and use of a qualified trainer and the training of recipients in the
- 29 use of such devices.

- 1 (3) The office shall establish and implement a policy for the
- 2 ultimate responsibility for recovery of ((TDDs)) TTs, signal devices,
- 3 and amplifying accessories from recipients who are moving from this
- 4 state or who for other reasons are no longer using them.
- 5 (4) Pursuant to recommendations of the ((TDD)) TRS program advisory
- 6 committee, the office shall maintain a program whereby a relay system
- 7 will be provided state-wide using operator intervention to connect
- 8 hearing impaired and speech impaired persons and offices or
- 9 organizations representing or serving the hearing impaired and speech
- 10 impaired, as determined and specified by the ((<del>TDD</del>)) TRS program
- 11 advisory committee pursuant to RCW 43.20A.730. ((The relay system)
- 12 shall be the most cost-effective possible and shall operate in a manner
- 13 consistent with federal requirements for such systems.)) Operation of
- 14 the relay service shall be bid out to a qualified contractor. The
- 15 department shall be guided by RCW 43.19.1911 in the selection of a
- 16 qualified contractor.
- 17 (5) <u>Intrastate interexchange carriers providing voice transmission</u>
- 18 service shall offer discounted rates for text telephone transmissions.
- 19 The utilities and transportation commission shall by rule set a minimum
- 20 percentage for the discount.
- 21 (6) The department shall prepare and submit an application for
- 22 <u>state certification by October 1, 1992, to the federal communications</u>
- 23 <u>commission</u>. The contract with the qualified contractor shall be
- 24 <u>concluded in sufficient time for the contractor to be fully operational</u>
- 25 and in compliance with applicable federal communications commission
- 26 regulations by July 26, 1993.
- 27 (7) In establishing the revised service by July 26, 1993, the
- 28 <u>department and the qualified contractor shall take necessary measures</u>
- 29 to ensure that the currently provided TRS remains viable until the
- 30 qualified contractor's revised service is fully operational.

(8) The program shall be funded by <u>a</u> telecommunications ((devices 1 2 for the deaf (TDD))) relay service (TRS) excise tax applied to each switched access line provided by the local exchange companies. 3 The 4 office shall determine, in consultation with the ((TDD)) TRS program advisory committee, the amount of money needed to fund the program on 5 6 an annual basis, including both operational costs and a reasonable amount for capital improvements such as equipment upgrade and 7 replacement. ((That information shall be given by the department in an 8 9 annual budget to the utilities and transportation commission no later 10 than March 1 prior to the beginning of the fiscal year. The utilities 11 and transportation commission shall then determine the amount of TDD 12 excise tax to be placed on each access line and)) The utilities and transportation commission shall transmit to the department, no later 13 14 than March 1 of each year, the number of switched access lines in the state as of the prior January 1. The department shall use this number 15 in calculating the amount of TRS excise tax to be placed on each 16 17 switched access line. The department shall inform each local exchange 18 company of this amount no later than May 15. The ((TDD)) TRS excise 19 tax shall not exceed ((ten)) fourteen cents per month per access line. 20 Each local exchange company shall impose the amount of excise tax determined by the ((commission)) department as of July 1, and shall 21 remit the amount collected directly to the department on a monthly 22 basis. The ((TDD)) TRS excise tax shall be separately identified on 23 24 each ratepayer's bill ((as "Telecommunications devices funds for deaf and hearing impaired")). All proceeds from the ((TDD)) TRS excise tax 25 shall be put into a fund to be administered by the office through the 26 27 department. 28 (((6))) (9) The office shall administer and control the award of

money to all parties incurring costs in implementing and maintaining

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telecommunications services, programs, equipment, and technical support

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- 1 services in accordance with ((the provisions of RCW 43.20A.725)) this 2 section.
- $((\frac{7}{1}))$  (10) The department shall provide the legislature with a 3 4 biennial report on the operation of the program. The first report shall be provided no later than December 1, 1990, and successive 5 6 reports every two years thereafter. Reports shall be prepared in consultation with the ((TDD)) TRS program advisory committee and the 7 utilities and transportation commission. The reports shall, at a 8 9 minimum, briefly outline the accomplishments of the program, the number 10 of persons ((served)) receiving equipment, the number of relay calls placed, revenues and expenditures, ((the prioritizing of services to 11 those eligible based on such factors as degree of physical handicap 12 or)) the allocation of the program's revenue between provision of 13 14 devices to individuals and operation of the state wide relay service, 15 other major policy or operational issues, and proposals for improvements or changes for the program. ((The first report shall 16 17 contain a study which includes examination of like programs in other 18 states, alternative methods of financing the program, alternative 19 methods of using the telecommunications system, advantages and 20 disadvantages of operating the TDD program from within the department, by telecommunications companies, and by a private, nonprofit 21 corporation, and means to limit demand for system usage. 22
- (8)) (11) The program shall be consistent with the requirements of federal law for the operation of both interstate and intrastate telecommunications services for ((the deaf or)) people with hearing ((impaired)) or speech ((impaired)) disabilities. The department ((and)), in consultation with the utilities and transportation commission, shall be responsible for ensuring compliance with federal requirements and shall provide timely notice to the legislature of any

legislation that may be required to accomplish compliance.

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Sec. 3. RCW 43.20A.730 and 1990 c 89 s 4 are each amended to read as follows:

(1) The department advisory committee on deafness shall establish 3 4 a ((TDD)) TRS program advisory committee to oversee operation of the ((<del>TDD</del>)) <u>TRS</u> program. The ((<del>TDD</del>)) <u>TRS program</u> advisory committee shall 5 6 consist of no more than thirteen individuals representing the hearing 7 impaired and speech impaired communities, the department, the utilities and transportation commission, agencies and services serving the 8 9 hearing impaired and speech impaired, and local exchange companies in 10 The membership on the ((TDD)) TRS program advisory the state. 11 committee shall, to the maximum extent possible, include from (a) the state-wide organizations 12 representatives major 13 representing the hearing impaired and speech impaired, 14 organizations for the hearing impaired and speech impaired located in 15 areas of the state with high populations of such persons, and (c) organizations that reflect the different geographic regions of the 16 17 state. In order to develop, implement, and maintain a state-wide relay 18 system providing cost-effective relay centers at a reasonable cost and 19 that will meet the requirements of the hearing impaired and speech 20 impaired, the ((TDD)) TRS program advisory committee shall investigate options, conduct public hearings as needed to ((determine the most 21 22 cost-effective method of operating a state-wide relay system providing 23 relay centers to the hearing impaired and speech impaired, and solicit 24 the advice, counsel, and assistance of interested parties and nonprofit 25 consumer organizations for hearing impaired and speech impaired persons state wide)) solicit feedback on the relay service and equipment 26 distribution program. The ((TDD)) TRS program advisory committee shall 27 28 also, in conjunction with the department, monitor the activities and 29 moneys that are being spent by the department for the program herein.

- 1 (2) The ((TDD)) TRS program advisory committee shall establish
- 2 criteria and specify state-wide organizations representing the hearing
- 3 or speech impaired meeting such criteria that are to receive
- 4 ((telecommunications devices)) text telephones pursuant to RCW
- 5 43.20A.725(1), and in which offices the equipment shall be installed if
- 6 an organization has more than one office.
