1 AN ACT Relating to metropolitan park districts; and amending RCW 2 35.61.010, 35.61.020, and 35.61.030.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 35.61.010 and 1985 c 416 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 ((Cities of five thousand or more population and such contiguous 7 property the residents of which may decide in favor thereof in the manner set forth in this chapter may create)) A metropolitan park 8 9 district may be created for the management, control, improvement, 10 maintenance, and acquisition of parks, parkways, and boulevards((+ 11 PROVIDED, That)) in a city with a population of at least five thousand or in an unincorporated area with a population of at least five 12 13 thousand.

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<u>No</u> municipal corporation of the fourth class shall be included within such metropolitan park district, and any such fourth class municipal corporation heretofore included within such district is hereby automatically withdrawn.

Except for the prohibition on including territory that is located 5 б in a fourth class municipal corporation, any territory that has been annexed to a metropolitan park district shall remain in the 7 metropolitan park district unless withdrawn as provided in this 8 chapter. Any metropolitan park district may annex territory as 9 provided in this chapter. In addition, any territory that is not 10 located within another metropolitan park district that is annexed to a 11 city in which a metropolitan park district is located shall be annexed 12 to the metropolitan park district automatically upon annexation to the 13 14 <u>city.</u>

15 Sec. 2. RCW 35.61.020 and 1965 c 7 s 35.61.020 are each amended to 16 read as follows:

17 A ballot proposition authorizing the creation of a metropolitan 18 park district shall be submitted to the voters of the area proposed to 19 be included in the proposed metropolitan park district at any general 20 election, or at any special election which may be called for that 21 purpose((, or at any city election held in the city in all of the 22 various voting precincts thereof)), if the metropolitan park district 23 is proposed by resolution of the city council or commission ((may, or 24 \overline{on})) in which the district is proposed to be located, by petition of fifteen percent of the ((qualified electors of the city based upon the 25 26 registration for the last preceding general city election, shall by 27 ordinance, submit to the voters of the city the proposition of creating 28 a metropolitan park district, the limits of which shall be coextensive

with the limits of the city as now or hereafter established, inclusive
 of territory annexed to and forming a part of the city.

3 Territory by virtue of its annexation to any city having heretofore
4 created a park district shall be deemed to be within the limits of the
5 metropolitan park district.

6 The city council or commission shall submit the proposition at a 7 special election to be called therefor when the petition so requests)) 8 voters of the city in which the district is proposed to be located, or 9 by petition of fifteen percent of the voters residing in the 10 unincorporated area within which the district is proposed to be 11 located.

12 The petition shall be submitted to the city council or commission 13 if the proposed metropolitan park district is proposed to be created in 14 the city and the city council or commission shall cause the ballot 15 proposition authorizing the metropolitan park district to be submitted 16 to the voters of the city.

17 The petition shall be submitted to the county legislative authority 18 in which all or the greatest geographic portion of the proposed 19 metropolitan park district is located if the district is proposed to be created in unincorporated territory. The county legislative authority 20 shall hold a public hearing on the creation of a proposed metropolitan 21 park district in unincorporated territory. After the public hearing, 22 23 the county legislative authority may adjust the boundaries of the proposed metropolitan park district, if it finds that the boundary 24 adjustment is in the public interest, and shall submit a ballot 25 proposition authorizing the creation of the metropolitan park district 26 to the voters residing in either the unincorporated area as proposed in 27 28 the petition or as it has been adjusted.

1 Sec. 3. RCW 35.61.030 and 1985 c 469 s 32 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 ((In submitting the question to the voters for their approval or 4 rejection, the city council or commission shall pass an ordinance declaring its intention to submit the proposition of creating a 5 б metropolitan park district to the qualified voters of the city. The 7 ordinance shall be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in the official newspaper of the city, and the city council or commission 8 9 shall cause to be placed upon the ballot for the election, at the 10 proper place,)) The ballot proposition ((which)) that is submitted to 11 the voters of the proposed metropolitan park district shall be 12 expressed in substantially the following terms:

13 () "For the formation of a metropolitan park district."

14 () "Against the formation of a metropolitan park district."

15 The metropolitan park district shall be created if the ballot 16 proposition is approved by a simple majority vote of the voters of the 17 proposed district voting on the proposition.

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
