## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 4414

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

Read first time April 10, 1991. Referred to Committee on Energy & Utilities.

- 1 WHEREAS, Many rural and suburban areas are not presently served by
- 2 water systems which are capable of adding commercial customers or
- 3 residential developments without additional facilities; and
- 4 WHEREAS, County comprehensive water planning often prevents a
- 5 developer or commercial customer from developing his or her own source
- 6 or going to another water purveyor other than the one designated for a
- 7 particular area; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Many water companies regulated by the Washington Utilities
- 9 and Transportation Commission require residential developers and
- 10 commercial customers to sign contracts to obtain water service; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The charges in such contracts are often in dispute; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The commission does not review such contracts unless they
- 13 have been signed by the company and the customer; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Water is an essential utility service and there is a need
- 15 to provide such service expeditiously and without unnecessary delay;
- 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives of
- 17 the state of Washington, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Select

- 1 Committee on Water Resource Policy conduct a study to determine whether
- 2 legislation is needed to establish procedures which will allow the
- 3 commission to set rates for individual water connections quickly and
- 4 fairly; and
- 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee study whether public and
- 6 private water systems not regulated by the Utilities and Transportation
- 7 Commission have similar problems; and
- 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings and
- 9 recommendations to the legislature at the regular session held in 1992.
