- 2 WASHINGTON, AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE
- 3 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF
- 4 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON, AND TO JUDITH BILLINGS, THE
- 5 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION, THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION, AND
- 6 ALL SCHOOL DISTRICTS IN THE STATE:
- 7 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 8 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 9 represent and petition as follows:
- 10 WHEREAS, The Constitution of the United States, the Bill of Rights,
- 11 and the Federalist papers embody our precious freedoms and our rich
- 12 heritage of liberty; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The Constitution of the United States, the Bill of Rights,
- 14 and the Federalist papers are lasting monuments to those dedicated
- 15 citizens who created the greatest democracy in the world, the United
- 16 States of America; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The Constitution of the United States, the Bill of Rights,
- 2 and the Federalist papers, having arisen from the conviction that
- 3 progress could be achieved through enlightened self-government, remain
- 4 sources of inspiration world-wide to those who love liberty; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Young people need to realize that inherent in citizenship
- 6 are duties including participation in the governmental process, being
- 7 intelligently informed, and voting; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Students need to read, discuss, and understand the
- 9 Washington State Constitution, United States Constitution, the Bill of
- 10 Rights, and the Federalist papers as basic documents of this nation and
- 11 state; and
- 12 WHEREAS, As citizens of this great nation, we are mindful of our
- 13 responsibilities and motivated to perpetuate the love of liberty;
- NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully urge each school
- 15 district to instruct all students in the meaning and history of the
- 16 Constitution of the United States, the Bill of Rights, and the
- 17 Federalist papers, so that students of public schools of the state of
- 18 Washington may fully understand the nature of liberty and may fully
- 19 appreciate their rich heritage as United States citizens; and

- 21 transmitted to the Honorable Booth Gardner, Governor of the State of
- 22 Washington, Judith Billings, the Superintendent of Public Instruction,
- 23 the State Board of Education, and all school districts in the State of
