1 AN ACT Relating to processor and preparer liens; and amending RCW 2 20.01.010 and 60.13.010.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 20.01.010 and 1989 c 354 s 37 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 As used in this title the terms defined in this section have the 7 meanings indicated unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

8 (1) "Director" means the director of agriculture or his duly9 authorized representative.

(2) "Person" means any natural person, firm, partnership, exchange,
association, trustee, receiver, corporation, and any member, officer,
or employee thereof or assignee for the benefit of creditors.

(3) "Agricultural product" means any unprocessed horticultural,
vermicultural and its byproducts, viticultural, berry, poultry, poultry

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product, grain, bee, or other agricultural products, and includes mint 1 or mint oil processed by or for the producer thereof and hay and straw 2 3 baled or prepared for market in any manner or form and livestock. 4 ((When used in RCW 60.13.020, "agricultural product" means 5 horticultural, viticultural, and berry products, hay and straw, and б turf and forage seed and applies only when such products are delivered to a processor or conditioner in an unprocessed form.)) 7

(4) "Producer" means any person engaged in the business of growing 8 or producing any agricultural product, whether as the owner of the 9 10 products, or producing the products for others holding the title thereof. 11

12 (5) "Consignor" means any producer, person, or his agent who sells, 13 ships, or delivers to any commission merchant, dealer, cash buyer, or 14 agent, any agricultural product for processing, handling, sale, or 15 resale.

"Commission merchant" means any person who receives on 16 (6) 17 consignment for sale or processing and sale from the consignor thereof any agricultural product for sale on commission on behalf of the 18 19 consignor, or who accepts any farm product in trust from the consignor 20 thereof for the purpose of resale, or who sells or offers for sale on commission any agricultural product, or who in any way handles for the 21 22 account of or as an agent of the consignor thereof, any agricultural 23 product.

(7) "Dealer" means any person other than a cash buyer, as defined 24 in subsection (10) of this section, who solicits, contracts for, or 25 obtains from the consignor thereof for reselling or processing, title, 26 27 possession, or control of any agricultural product, or who buys or agrees to buy any agricultural product from the consignor thereof for 28 29 sale or processing and includes any person, other than one who acts solely as a producer, who retains title in an agricultural product and 30 SHB 1142.PL

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1 delivers it to a producer for further production or increase. For the 2 purposes of this chapter, the term dealer includes any person who 3 purchases livestock on behalf of and for the account of another, or who 4 purchases cattle in another state or country and imports these cattle 5 into this state for resale.

6 (8) "Limited dealer" means any person operating under the 7 alternative bonding provision in RCW 20.01.211.

8 (9) "Broker" means any person other than a commission merchant, 9 dealer, or cash buyer who negotiates the purchase or sale of any 10 agricultural product, but no broker may handle the agricultural 11 products involved or proceeds of the sale.

12 "Cash buyer" means any person other than a commission (10)merchant, dealer, or broker, who obtains from the consignor thereof for 13 14 the purpose of resale or processing, title, possession, or control of any agricultural product or who contracts for the title, possession, or 15 control of any agricultural product, or who buys or agrees to buy for 16 17 resale any agricultural product by paying to the consignor at the time 18 of obtaining possession or control of any agricultural product the full 19 agreed price of the agricultural product, in coin or currency, lawful 20 money of the United States. However, a cashier's check, certified check, or bankdraft may be used for the payment. For the purposes of 21 this subsection, "agricultural product," does not include hay, grain, 22 straw, or livestock. 23

(11) "Agent" means any person who, on behalf of any commission merchant, dealer, broker, or cash buyer, acts as liaison between a consignor and a principal, or receives, contracts for, or solicits any agricultural product from the consignor thereof or who negotiates the consignment or purchase of any agricultural product on behalf of any commission merchant, dealer, broker, or cash buyer and who transacts all or a portion of that business at any location other than at the

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principal place of business of his employer. With the exception of an
 agent for a commission merchant or dealer handling horticultural
 products, an agent may operate only in the name of one principal and
 only to the account of that principal.

5 (12) "Retail merchant" means any person operating from a bona fide 6 or established place of business selling agricultural products twelve 7 months of each year.

(13) "Fixed or established place of business" for the purpose of 8 9 this chapter means any permanent warehouse, building, or structure, at 10 which necessary and appropriate equipment and fixtures are maintained 11 for properly handling those agricultural products generally dealt in, and at which supplies of the agricultural products being usually 12 transported are stored, offered for sale, sold, delivered, and 13 14 generally dealt ((in)) with in quantities reasonably adequate for and usually carried for the requirements of such a business, and that is 15 16 recognized as a permanent business at such place, and carried on as 17 such in good faith and not for the purpose of evading this chapter, and where specifically designated personnel are available to handle 18 transactions concerning those agricultural products generally dealt in, 19 20 which personnel are available during designated and appropriate hours to that business, and shall not mean a residence, barn, garage, tent, 21 22 temporary stand or other temporary quarters, any railway car, or 23 permanent quarters occupied pursuant to any temporary arrangement.

(14) "Processor" means any person, firm, company, or other organization that purchases agricultural crops from a consignor and that cans, freezes, dries, dehydrates, cooks, presses, powders, or otherwise processes those crops in any manner whatsoever for eventual resale.

(15) "Pooling contract" means any written agreement whereby a
 consignor delivers a horticultural product to a commission merchant
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1 under terms whereby the commission merchant may commingle the 2 consignor's horticultural products for sale with others similarly 3 agreeing, which must include all of the following:

4 (a) A delivery receipt for the consignor that indicates the variety
5 of horticultural product delivered, the number of containers, or the
6 weight and tare thereof;

7 (b) Horticultural products received for handling and sale in the 8 fresh market shall be accounted for to the consignor with individual 9 pack-out records that shall include variety, grade, size, and date of 10 delivery. Individual daily packing summaries shall be available within 11 forty-eight hours after packing occurs. However, platform inspection 12 shall be acceptable by mutual contract agreement on small deliveries to 13 determine variety, grade, size, and date of delivery;

14 (c) Terms under which the commission merchant may use his judgment15 in regard to the sale of the pooled horticultural product;

16 (d) The charges to be paid by the consignor as filed with the state 17 of Washington;

(e) A provision that the consignor shall be paid for his pool contribution when the pool is in the process of being marketed in direct proportion, not less than eighty percent of his interest less expenses directly incurred, prior liens, and other advances on the grower's crop unless otherwise mutually agreed upon between grower and commission merchant.

24 (16) "Date of sale" means the date agricultural products are 25 delivered to the person buying the products.

(17) "Conditioner" means any person, firm, company, or other
 organization that receives turf, forage, or vegetable seeds from a
 consignor for drying or cleaning.

29 (18) "Seed bailment contract" means any contract meeting the 30 requirements of chapter 15.48 RCW.

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(19) "Proprietary seed" means any seed that is protected under the
 Federal Plant Variety Protection Act.

3 (20) "Licensed public weighmaster" means any person, licensed under 4 the provisions of chapter 15.80 RCW, who weighs, measures, or counts 5 any commodity or thing and issues therefor a signed certified 6 statement, ticket, or memorandum of weight, measure, or count upon 7 which the purchase or sale of any commodity or upon which the basic 8 charge of payment for services rendered is based.

9 (21) "Certified weight" means any signed certified statement or 10 memorandum of weight, measure or count issued by a licensed public 11 weighmaster in accordance with the provisions of chapter 15.80 RCW.

12 Sec. 2. RCW 60.13.010 and 1987 c 148 s 1 are each amended to read 13 as follows:

As used in this chapter, the terms defined in this section have the meanings indicated unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

16 (1) "Agricultural product((-))" means any unprocessed horticultural, vermicultural and its byproducts, viticultural, berry, 17 18 poultry, poultry product, grain, bee, or other agricultural products, 19 and includes mint or mint oil processed by or for the producer thereof and hay and straw baled or prepared for market in any manner or form 20 and livestock. When used in RCW 60.13.020, "agricultural product" 21 means horticultural, viticultural, aquacultural, or berry products, hay 22 23 and straw, milk and milk products, or turf and forage seed and applies 24 only when such products are delivered to a processor or conditioner in 25 an unprocessed form.

26 (2) "Conditioner," "consignor," "person," (("processor,")) and 27 "producer" have the meanings defined in RCW 20.01.010.

28 (((2))) (3) "Delivers" means that a producer completes the 29 performance of all contractual obligations with reference to the SHB 1142.PL p. 6 of 7 1 transfer of actual or constructive possession or control of an 2 agricultural product to a processor or conditioner or preparer, 3 regardless of whether the processor or conditioner or preparer takes 4 physical possession.

5 (4) "Preparer" means a person engaged in the business of feeding
6 livestock or preparing livestock products for market.

7 (((3))) (5) "Processor" means any person, firm, company, or other 8 organization that purchases agricultural products except milk and milk 9 products from a consignor and that cans, freezes, dries, dehydrates, 10 cooks, presses, powders, or otherwise processes those crops in any 11 manner whatsoever for eventual resale, or that purchases or markets 12 milk from a dairy producer and is obligated to remit payment to such 13 dairy producer directly.

14 (6) "Commercial fisherman" means a person licensed to fish 15 commercially for or to take food fish or shellfish or steelhead legally 16 caught pursuant to executive order, treaty right, or federal statute. 17 ((4))) (7) "Fish" means food fish or shellfish or steelhead 18 legally caught pursuant to executive order, treaty right, or federal 19 statute.
