have had at least one year's experience in train service) and none of 1 2 the said crew shall be required or permitted to perform the duties of 3 train baggageman or express messenger while on the road)) No law or order of any regulatory agency of this state shall prevent a common 4 carrier by railroad from staffing its passenger trains in accordance 5 6 with collective bargaining agreements or any national or other 7 applicable settlement of train crew size. In the absence of a collective bargaining agreement or any national or other applicable 8 settlement of train crew size, any common carrier railroad operating a 9 10 passenger train with a crew of less than two members shall be subject to a safety review by the Washington utilities and transportation 11 12 commission, which, as to staffing, may issue an order requiring as many 13 as two crew members.
