Read first time January 23, 1991. Referred to Committee on Health & Long-Term Care.

AN ACT Relating to practical nurses; amending RCW 18.78.005,
18.78.020, 18.78.030, 18.78.040, 18.78.050, 18.78.055, 18.78.060,
18.78.080, and 18.78.100; reenacting and amending RCW 18.78.090; and
repealing RCW 18.78.110.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 Sec. 1. RCW 18.78.005 and 1983 c 55 s 1 are each amended to read 7 as follows:

The purpose of this chapter is to protect the health of the general 8 9 public and to provide for the establishment and enforcement of 10 standards for licensing practical nurses. Any person offering to 11 practice as a licensed practical nurse or using any title, representation, sign, or device to indicate that the person is 12 practicing as a practical nurse or licensed practical nurse in this 13 14 state shall submit evidence that he or she is qualified to practice and 15 shall be licensed as provided in this chapter.

1 sec. 2. RCW 18.78.020 and 1983 c 55 s 3 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 There is hereby created a board to be known and designated as the 4 "Washington state board of practical nursing." The board <u>of practical</u> 5 <u>nursing</u> shall be composed of five members, appointed by the governor as 6 follows:

7 (1) <u>Two members shall be licensed practical nurses who shall have</u> 8 <u>had not less than five years' actual experience as a licensed practical</u> 9 <u>nurse and who have practiced as a practical nurse within two years of</u> 10 <u>appointment;</u>

11 (2) Two members shall be licensed registered nurses who have no 12 less than five years' experience in the practice of nursing, one of 13 whom shall be a registered nurse actively engaged in instructing in an 14 approved practical nursing course, and one of whom shall be a 15 registered nurse supervisor of licensed practical nurses;

16 (((2))) (3) There shall be one public member who does not derive 17 his or her livelihood primarily from the provision of health services 18 and is not:

19 (a) A present or former member of another licensing board;

20 (b) A licensed health professional; or

21 (c) An employee of a health care facility($(\dot{\tau})$).

(((3) Two members shall be licensed practical nurses who shall have had not less than five years' actual experience as a licensed practical nurse and who have practiced as a practical nurse within two years of appointment.))

26 **Sec. 3.** RCW 18.78.030 and 1983 c 55 s 4 are each amended to read 27 as follows:

28 ((On July 24, 1983, the members of the board shall be appointed to 29 serve as follows:

1 (1) One licensed practical nurse for a term of five years;

2 (2) One registered nurse for a term of four years;

3 (3) One licensed practical nurse for a term of three years;

- 4 (4) One registered nurse for a term of two years; and
- 5 (5) One public member for a term of one year.

6 Thereafter all appointments shall be for terms of five years each.)) Vacancies occurring on the board shall be filled for the 7 unexpired term by appointment of the governor, who also may remove any 8 9 member from the board for neglect of duty required by law, ((or)) for 10 incompetency, or <u>for</u> unprofessional ((or disorderly)) conduct <u>as</u> defined in chapter 18.130 RCW. All appointments shall be for terms of 11 five years each. No person may serve as a member of the board for more 12 than two consecutive terms, except that a member who is filling less 13 14 than one-half of an uncompleted term shall be eligible for two full terms in addition to the uncompleted term. Board members shall serve 15 16 until a successor is appointed.

17 The board shall meet at least quarterly at times and places it 18 designates. It shall hold such other meetings during the year as may 19 be deemed necessary to transact its business. A majority of the board 20 currently serving shall constitute a quorum at any meeting.

21 Sec. 4. RCW 18.78.040 and 1984 c 287 s 47 are each amended to read 22 as follows:

Each board member shall be compensated in accordance with RCW 43.03.240 and shall be paid travel expenses while away from home in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060. The ((members of the)) board shall appoint ((a chairman and a secretary from among its entire members, who shall serve until his or her successor is appointed by the board)) officers annually. 1 Sec. 5. RCW 18.78.050 and 1988 c 211 s 4 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 The board shall conduct examinations for all applicants for 4 licensure under this chapter and shall certify qualified applicants for 5 <u>licensure</u> to the department ((of licensing for licensing)). The board 6 in consultation with the state board for community college education and the superintendent of public instruction shall also determine and 7 formulate what constitutes the curriculum for ((an)) approved practical 8 9 nursing ((program)) schools/programs and shall establish criteria for 10 minimum standards for schools/programs preparing persons for licensure under this chapter. The board shall establish criteria for licensure 11 by endorsement. 12

The board may adopt rules or issue advisory opinions in response to 13 14 questions from professional health associations, health care practitioners, and consumers in this state concerning licensed 15 practical nurse practice. The board shall establish criteria for proof 16 17 of reasonable currency of knowledge and skill as a basis for safe practice ((after three years inactive or lapsed status)) of practical 18 19 nursing.

20 The board shall adopt such rules as are necessary to fulfill the 21 purposes of this chapter pursuant to chapter 34.05 RCW.

22 Sec. 6. RCW 18.78.055 and 1983 c 55 s 7 are each amended to read 23 as follows:

An institution desiring to conduct a school/program of practical nursing shall apply to the board and submit evidence satisfactory to the board that: (1) It is prepared to carry out the approved curriculum for an approved practical nursing school/program; and (2) it is prepared to meet other standards established by this chapter and by the board.

If in the opinion of the board ((the curriculum of a program of))
 <u>a school/program of</u> practical nursing meets the requirements of <u>this</u>
 <u>chapter and</u> the board, the program shall be approved.

4 All approved practical nursing ((programs)) <u>schools/programs</u> in the state shall be surveyed and the board shall review written reports 5 б of each survey. The surveys shall be conducted periodically as determined by the board. If the board determines that an approved 7 practical nursing ((program)) school/program is not maintaining the 8 curriculum standards or other standards required ((for approval, the 9 board shall give)) by the board written notice shall be given 10 specifying the deficiencies. Failure to correct the deficiencies 11 within a period of time specified by the board shall result in the 12 suspension of the program's approval. 13

14 Sec. 7. RCW 18.78.060 and 1988 c 212 s 1 are each amended to read 15 as follows:

An applicant for a license to practice nursing as a licensed practical nurse shall submit to the board written evidence, on a form provided by the board, verified under oath, that the applicant:

19 (1) Is at least eighteen years of age;

20 (2) Is of good moral character;

21 (3) Is of good physical and mental health;

(4) Has ((completed at least a tenth grade course or its
equivalent, as determined by the board)) a high school diploma or
general educational development certificate or diploma;

(5) Has completed an approved program ((of not less than nine months)) for the education of practical nurses, or its equivalent, as determined by the board((-));

(7) The applicant at the time of such submission shall not be in
 violation of chapter 18.130 RCW or any provisions of this chapter.

To be licensed as a practical nurse, each applicant shall be 3 required to pass an examination in such subjects as the board may 4 determine within the scope of and commensurate with the work to be 5 б performed by a licensed practical nurse. Upon approval by the board, the department shall issue an interim permit authorizing the applicant 7 to practice nursing as authorized under this chapter pending 8 9 notification of the results of the first licensing examination following verification of satisfactory completion of an approved 10 program of practical nursing. Any applicant failing to pass ((such 11 an)) the examination may apply for reexamination. If the applicant 12 fails the examination, the interim permit expires upon notification and 13 14 is not renewable. Upon passing ((such)) the examination ((as determined by the board, the director shall issue)) a license shall be 15 <u>issued</u> to the applicant ((a license)) to practice as a licensed 16 17 practical nurse, providing the license fee is paid by the applicant and 18 the applicant meets all other requirements of the board.

19 Sec. 8. RCW 18.78.080 and 1985 c 7 s 65 are each amended to read 20 as follows:

21 ((All)) Applicants applying for a license to practice as a licensed practical nurse, with or without examination((, as provided in this 22 chapter,)), or for reexamination, shall pay ((a license)) fees 23 24 determined by the ((director)) <u>secretary</u> as provided in RCW 25 ((43.24.086)) 43.70.250 to the department ((of licensing: PROVIDED, 26 HOWEVER, That the applicant applying for a reexamination shall pay a 27 fee determined by the director as provided in RCW 43.24.086)).

Sec. 9. RCW 18.78.090 c 1986 c 259 s 131 and 1985 c 7 s 66 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

Every licensed practical nurse in this state shall renew the 3 4 license with the department ((of licensing and)), shall pay a fee determined by the ((director)) secretary as provided in 5 RCW б ((43.24.086)) 43.70.250, and shall provide evidence of knowledge and skill in current practice as required by the board. Any failure to 7 register ((and)), pay the renewal registration fee, or meet the 8 requirements of the board shall render the license ((invalid, but 9 10 such)) lapsed. The lapsed license shall be reinstated ((upon written application therefor and)) upon payment to the state of ((a)) renewal 11 12 and penalty fees determined by the ((director)) secretary as provided in RCW ((43.24.086)) 43.70.250 and upon compliance with the rules 13 14 established by the board.

15 Sec. 10. RCW 18.78.100 and 1983 c 55 s 11 are each amended to read 16 as follows:

After consultation with the board, the ((director)) secretary shall appoint an executive secretary of the board to carry out the provisions of this chapter ((who shall have the following qualifications:

20 (1) Be a registered nurse in the state of Washington;

21 (2) Be the holder of a baccalaureate degree from an accredited
22 four-year institution of higher education;

23 (3) Have not less than five years' experience in the field of 24 nursing; and

25 (4) Have not less than two years' experience in nursing 26 education)).

27 <u>The board and secretary shall determine the qualifications required</u>
28 <u>to be employed as the executive secretary.</u>
