

SENATE BILL 5625

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

By Senators Newhouse, Rinehart, Patterson and Pelz; by request of Department of Community Development.

Read first time February 12, 1991. Referred to Committee on Ways & Means.

1 AN ACT Relating to appropriations for projects recommended by the
2 public works board; creating new sections; making an appropriation; and
3 declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** Pursuant to chapter 43.155 RCW, the
6 following project loans recommended by the public works board are
7 authorized to be made with funds previously appropriated from the
8 public works assistance account:

9 (1) Annapolis Water District--water project--replace three
10 existing wells by drilling new wells \$575,000

11 (2) Asotin County--sewer project--participate with the
12 City of Clarkston in regional sewage treatment plant upgrade \$968,400

13 (3) City of Bellevue--storm sewer project--replace portions of
14 storm drainage system and install an oil/water separator . \$377,100

1 (4) City of Bellingham--sanitary sewer project--replace
2 deteriorated trunk sewer \$445,500

3 (5) Cape San Juan Water District--water project--construct new
4 well to remove salt water intrusion hazard \$30,411

5 (6) Chelan County PUD No. 1--sanitary sewer project--construct new
6 waste water system around Lake Wenatchee \$2,500,000

7 (7) City of Cheney--sanitary sewer project--construct a new waste
8 water treatment facility to meet discharge standards . . \$2,500,000

9 (8) Clark County--sanitary sewer project--construct new trunk
10 sewer and extend sewer to elementary school \$243,200

26 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** (1) In addition to the money previously
27 appropriated in the 1989-91 capital budget, there is hereby
28 appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 1991, seven million three
29 hundred thirty thousand dollars from the public works assistance

1 account for the purpose of providing the following loans also
2 recommended by the public works board for funding:

3 (a) Jefferson County PUD No. 1--water project--improve Triten Cove
4 and Lazy C water systems \$371,000

5 (b) Mukilteo Water District--water project--replace a deteriorated
6 water transmission line \$284,000

7 (c) North Perry Avenue Water District--water project--replace
8 undersized pipes and install additional pipes throughout system
9 \$2,259,947

10 (d) City of Olympia--road project--repair and rehabilitate four
11 major downtown streets \$1,254,200

12 (e) City of Redmond--road project--improve a hazardous
13 intersection and drainage in area \$750,000

14 (f) City of Seattle--road project--improve deteriorated roadway
15 and increase safety for motorists, bicyclists, and pedestrians
16 \$2,432,520

17 (2) Total approved list from this section and section 1 of this
18 act \$59,251,667

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate
19 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
20 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
21 effect immediately.
