1 AN ACT Relating to tuition waivers for graduate students pursuing 2 degrees in music; adding a new section to chapter 28B.15 RCW; and 3 creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes the vigorous 6 national and international competition for talented students of the 7 musical arts. In order to allow Washington institutions to compete successfully for the very limited number of outstanding music students 8 the legislature intends to permit the governing boards of the four-year 9 10 institutions of higher education to waive tuition and fees for a 11 certain proportion of the graduate students pursuing degrees in the 12 musical arts.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28B.15 RCW 14 to read as follows: 1 The boards of regents or trustees of the state universities, the 2 regional universities, and The Evergreen State College may waive the 3 tuition and services and activities fees for graduate students pursuing 4 degrees in the musical arts. Such waivers may only be granted to a 5 maximum of twenty-five percent of the graduate students pursuing music 6 degrees at each of these institutions.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. If any provision of this act or its 8 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 9 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 10 persons or circumstances is not affected.
