## SENATE BILL 5673

State of Washington52nd Legislature1991 Regular SessionBy Senators McMullen, Metcalf and Owen.

Read first time February 14, 1991. Referred to Committee on Commerce & Labor.

1 AN ACT Relating to a fish and wildlife work force; adding a new 2 chapter to Title 50 RCW; providing an effective date; providing an 3 expiration date; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature finds that an increase б in unemployment due to the declining timber economy in the state is 7 imminent. The legislature further recognizes that employment opportunities in other natural resource management professions exist 8 9 and that natural resource enhancements in the areas of fisheries, 10 wildlife, and recreation can bring needed income to distressed local 11 economies in the state. It is the intent of the legislature that 12 displaced timber workers be given training in and opportunities to compete for employment in other resource management professions, and to 13 14 establish a pilot program in Skagit county to accomplish this The Skagit river represents a potential recreational 15 objective.

1 fishery that, if enhanced, will bring much needed income to Skagit 2 county. Enhancements to the fishery on the Skagit river are planned 3 over the next several years, and workers will be needed to fill these 4 positions. Displaced timber workers will be available to do this 5 work.

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. Unless the context clearly requires 7 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this 8 chapter.

9 (1) "Department" means the employment security department.

10 (2) "Dislocated timber worker" means any individual who:

(a) Has been terminated or received a notice of termination from
employment in a timber-related occupation;

(b) Is eligible for or has exhausted entitlement to unemploymentcompensation benefits; and

15 (c) Is unlikely to return to employment in the individual's 16 principal occupation or previous industry because of a diminishing 17 demand for his or her skills in that occupation or industry.

18 (3) "College" means Skagit Valley Community College.

19 (4) "Local development agency" means the economic development20 association of Skagit county.

21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A pilot project shall be established, 22 coordinated jointly by the department and the college, in Skagit 23 county. The project shall be of five years duration.

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. The college shall develop a training 25 program designed for dislocated timber workers and their spouses, and 26 in doing so, shall:

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1 (1) Consult with, at a minimum, the departments of natural 2 resources, ecology, wildlife, and fisheries, the parks and recreation 3 commission, and other state, federal, local, and private employers in 4 Skagit county to determine minimum employment qualifications in the 5 areas of natural resource management and enhancement of the Skagit 6 river; and

7 (2) Develop a program that will provide needed educational skills8 to dislocated timber workers and their spouses.

9 NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. The department shall contract with the 10 local development agency to coordinate with the college and the departments of wildlife, ecology, natural resources, and fisheries, the 11 parks and recreation commission, and other state, federal, local, and 12 13 private employers in assisting dislocated timber workers and their spouses in securing education and employment in the natural resource 14 local development agency shall also provide 15 professions. The 16 information on the training program established under section 4 of this 17 act.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. The department and the college shall jointly report to the legislature on their progress by November 1 of each year, beginning in 1991 and ending November 1, 1996. This report shall include a college program description, numbers of students, numbers of referrals for existing positions by the local development agency, and numbers of positions filled by dislocated timber workers.

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. This act shall expire January 1, 1997.

25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. Sections 1 through 7 of this act shall
26 constitute a new chapter in Title 50 RCW.

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1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 9. This act is necessary for the immediate 2 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 3 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take 4 effect July 15, 1991.
