State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

By Senators L. Kreidler, West and Johnson; by request of Department of Health.

Read first time February 19, 1991. Referred to Committee on Health & Long-Term Care.

AN ACT Relating to the regulation of persons who apply ionizing radiation to human beings; amending RCW 18.84.010, 18.84.020, 18.84.030, and 18.84.040; adding new sections to chapter 18.84 RCW; repealing RCW 43.131.349, 43.131.350, and 18.84.900; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 Sec. 1. RCW 18.84.010 and 1987 c 412 s 1 are each amended to read 8 as follows:

9 It is the intent and purpose of this chapter to protect the public 10 ((by setting standards of qualification, education, training, and 11 experience for use)) by the certification and registration of 12 practitioners of radiological technology. By promoting high standards 13 of professional performance, by requiring professional accountability, 14 and by credentialing those persons who seek to provide radiological 15 technology under the title of radiological technologists, and by regulating all persons utilizing ionizing radiation on human beings this chapter identifies those practitioners who have achieved a particular level of competency. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to require that individual or group policies or contracts of an insurance carrier, health care service contractor, or health maintenance organization provide benefits or coverage for services and supplies provided by a person certified under this chapter.

8 The legislature finds and declares that this chapter conforms to 9 the guidelines, terms, and definitions for the credentialing of health 10 or health-related professions specified under chapter 18.120 RCW.

11 Sec. 2. RCW 18.84.020 and 1987 c 412 s 3 are each amended to read 12 as follows:

13 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in 14 this section apply throughout this chapter.

15 (1) "Department" means the department of ((licensing)) <u>health</u>.

16 (2) (("Director" means the director of licensing)) "Secretary" 17 means the secretary of health.

18 (3) "Licensed practitioner" means a physician or osteopathic 19 physician licensed under chapter 18.71 or 18.57 RCW, respectively; a registered nurse licensed under chapter 18.88 RCW; 20 ((or)) a ((podiatrist)) podiatric physician and surgeon licensed under chapter 21 18.22 RCW; a naturopath licensed under chapter 18.36A RCW; a physician 22 assistant licensed under chapter 18.71A or 18.57A RCW; a dentist 23 licensed under chapter 18.32 RCW; a dental hygienist licensed under 24 chapter 18.29 RCW; or a chiropractor licensed under chapter 18.25 RCW. 25 (4) "Radiologic technologist" means an individual certified under 26 27 this chapter, other than a licensed practitioner, who practices 28 radiologic technology as a:

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1 (a) Diagnostic radiologic technologist, who is a person who 2 actually handles x-ray equipment in the process of applying radiation 3 on a human being for diagnostic purposes ((under the supervision)) at 4 the direction of a licensed practitioner; or

5 (b) Therapeutic radiologic technologist, who is a person who uses 6 radiation-generating equipment for therapeutic purposes on human 7 subjects at the direction of a licensed practitioner; or

8 (c) Nuclear medicine technologist, who is a person who prepares 9 radiopharmaceuticals and administers them to human beings for 10 diagnostic and therapeutic purposes and who performs in vivo and in 11 vitro detection and measurement of radioactivity for medical purposes 12 ((under the supervision)) at the direction of a licensed practitioner. 13 (5) "Advisory committee" means the Washington state radiologic 14 technology advisory committee.

(6) "Approved school of radiologic technology" means a school of radiologic technology approved by the council on medical education of the American medical association or a school found to maintain the equivalent of such a course of study as determined by the department. Such school may be operated by a medical or educational institution, and for the purpose of providing the requisite clinical experience, shall be affiliated with one or more general hospitals.

(7) "Radiologic technology" means the use of ionizing radiationupon a human being for diagnostic or therapeutic purposes.

(8) "Radiologist" means a physician certified by the American board
of radiology or the American osteopathic board of radiology.

26 (9) "Registered x-ray technician" means a person who is registered
27 with the department, and who applies ionizing radiation at the
28 direction of a licensed practitioner.

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1 Sec. 3. RCW 18.84.030 and 1987 c 412 s 2 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 No person may ((represent himself or herself to the public as a 4 certified radiologic technologist without holding a valid certificate to practice under this chapter)) practice radiologic technology without 5 6 being registered or certified under this chapter, unless that person is a licensed practitioner as defined in RCW 18.84.020(3). A person 7 represents himself or herself to the public as a certified radiological 8 technologist when that person adopts or uses a title or description of 9 10 services that incorporates one or more of the following items or designations: 11

(1) Certified radiologic technologist or CRT, for persons socertified under this chapter;

14 (2) Certified radiologic therapy technologist, CRTT, or CRT, for15 persons certified in the therapeutic field;

(3) Certified radiologic diagnostic technologist, CRDT, or CRT, forpersons certified in the diagnostic field; or

(4) Certified nuclear medicine technologist, CNMT, or CRT, forpersons certified as nuclear medicine technologists.

20 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. The secretary may issue a registration to an applicant who submits, on forms provided by the department, the 21 22 applicant's name, the address, occupational title, name and location of 23 business where applicant performs his or her services, and other 24 information as determined by the secretary, including information necessary to determine whether there are grounds for denial of 25 registration under this chapter or chapter 18.130 RCW. Each applicant 26 27 shall pay a fee as determined by the secretary as provided in RCW 28 43.70.250. The secretary shall establish by rule the procedural

requirements and fees for registration and for renewal of
 registrations.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. 3 The secretary may provide educational materials and training to registered x-ray technicians, certified 4 radiologic technologists, licensed practitioners and the public 5 concerning, but not limited to, health risks associated with ionizing б radiation, proper radiographic techniques, and x-ray equipment 7 8 maintenance. The secretary may charge fees to recover the cost of 9 providing educational materials and training.

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. Nothing in this chapter may be construed to 11 prohibit or restrict the practice of a profession by a person who is 12 either registered, certified, licensed, or similarly regulated under 13 the laws of this state who is performing services within the person's 14 authorized scope of practice.

15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. Persons required to register under this
16 chapter must be registered by January 1, 1992.

17 Sec. 8. RCW 18.84.040 and 1987 c 412 s 5 are each amended to read 18 as follows:

19 (1) In addition to any other authority provided by law, the 20 ((director)) secretary may in consultation with the advisory committee: 21 (a) Adopt rules, in accordance with chapter 34.05 RCW, necessary to 22 implement this chapter;

23 (b) Set all <u>registration</u>, certification, and renewal fees in 24 accordance with RCW ((43.24.086)) <u>43.70.250</u>;

25 (c) Establish forms and procedures necessary to administer this 26 chapter;

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(d) Evaluate and designate those schools from which graduation will
 be accepted as proof of an applicant's eligibility to receive a
 certificate;

4 (e) Determine whether alternative methods of training are 5 equivalent to formal education, and to establish forms, procedures, and 6 criteria for evaluation of an applicant's alternative training to 7 determine the applicant's eligibility to receive a certificate;

8 (f) Issue a certificate to any applicant who has met the education,
9 training, and conduct requirements for certification; and

10 (g) <u>Issue a registration to an applicant who meets the requirement</u> 11 <u>for a registration.</u>

12 (2) The secretary may hire clerical, administrative, and 13 investigative staff as needed to implement this chapter.

14 (((2))) (3) The uniform disciplinary act, chapter 18.130 RCW, 15 governs the issuance and denial of <u>registrations and</u> certifications, 16 <u>unregistered and</u> uncertified practice, and the discipline of 17 <u>registrants and</u> certificants under this chapter. The ((director shall 18 be)) <u>secretary is</u> the disciplining authority under this chapter.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 9. Sections 4 through 7 of this act are each
added to chapter 18.84 RCW.

26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 11. This act is necessary for the immediate 27 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the SB 5775 p. 6 of 7 1 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take

2 effect July 1, 1991.
