## SENATE BILL 6069

- 1 AN ACT Relating to bone marrow transplants; adding new sections to
- 2 chapter 70.54 RCW; creating a new section; and making an appropriation.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that an estimated
- sixteen thousand American children and adults are stricken each year 5
- 6 with leukemia, aplastic anemia, or other fatal blood diseases.
- 7 many of these individuals, bone marrow transplantation is the only
- chance for survival. Nearly seventy percent cannot find a suitable 8
- bone marrow match within their own families. The chance that a patient 9
- 10 will find a matching, unrelated donor in the general population is
- 11 between one in a hundred and one in a million.
- 12 The legislature further finds that because tissue types are
- inherited, and different tissue types are found in different ethnic 13
- 14 groups, the chances of finding an unrelated donor vary according to the

- 1 patient's ethnic and racial background. Patients from minority groups
- 2 are therefore less likely to find matching, unrelated donors.
- 3 It is the intent of the legislature to establish a state-wide bone
- 4 marrow donor education and recruitment program in order to increase the
- 5 number of Washington residents who become bone marrow donors, and to
- 6 increase the chance that patients in need of bone marrow transplants
- 7 will find a suitable bone marrow match.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The department of health shall establish
- 9 a bone marrow donor recruitment and education program to educate
- 10 residents of the state about:
- 11 (1) The need for bone marrow donors;
- 12 (2) The procedures required to become registered as a potential
- 13 bone marrow donor, including procedures for determining a person's
- 14 tissue type; and
- 15 (3) The procedures a donor must undergo to donate bone marrow or
- 16 other sources of blood stem cells.
- 17 The department of health shall make special efforts to educate and
- 18 recruit citizens from minority populations to volunteer as potential
- 19 bone marrow donors. Means of communication may include use of press,
- 20 radio, and television, and placement of educational materials in
- 21 appropriate health care facilities, blood banks, and state and local
- 22 agencies. The department of health in conjunction with the department
- 23 of licensing shall make educational materials available at all places
- 24 where driver licenses are issued or renewed.
- 25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The department of health shall make
- 26 special efforts to educate and recruit state employees to volunteer as
- 27 potential bone marrow donors. Such efforts shall include, but not be
- 28 limited to, conducting a bone marrow donor drive to encourage state

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- 1 employees to volunteer as potential bone marrow donors. The drive
- 2 shall include educational materials furnished by the national bone
- 3 marrow donor program and presentations that explain the need for bone
- 4 marrow donors, and the procedures for becoming registered as potential
- 5 bone marrow donors. The cost of educational materials and
- 6 presentations to state employees shall be borne by the national bone
- 7 marrow donor program.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The sum of forty thousand dollars, or as
- 9 much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the biennium
- 10 ending June 30, 1993, from the general fund to the department of health
- 11 for the purposes of implementing sections 2 and 3 of this act.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** Sections 2 and 3 of this act are each
- 13 added to chapter 70.54 RCW.
