## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 8403

State of Washington 52nd Legislature 1991 Regular Session

Read first time January 31, 1991. Referred to Committee on Energy & Utilities.

- 1 WHEREAS, Washington is a party to the Northwest interstate compact
- 2 on low-level radioactive waste management; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Ten years have passed since the compact was enacted into
- 4 law; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Circumstances, including economics, environmental,
- 6 political, and sociological factors, that were the foundation for the
- 7 original compact have naturally evolved and changed since the compact
- 8 was formulated and agreed to; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The compact at its inception was thoughtful in its
- 10 addressing of the problems associated with disposal of low-level waste
- 11 throughout the region; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Given the various changes over the years, it behooves
- 13 Washington as a host state to evaluate, with cooperation of the other
- 14 member states, the Northwest interstate compact on low-level
- 15 radioactive waste management;
- 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Senate of the state of
- 17 Washington, the House of Representatives concurring, That a joint

- 1 select committee on the Northwest interstate compact on low-level
- 2 radioactive waste management be established to review the compact and
- 3 make recommendations on changes; and
- 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee consist of eight
- 5 members, four members from the senate, selected by the President of the
- 6 Senate, and four members from the House of Representatives, selected by
- 7 the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and
- 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings and
- 9 recommendations to the legislature at the regular session held in 1992.
