- 1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND
- 2 TO THE HONORABLE BOOTH GARDNER, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON,
- 3 AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 4 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 5 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, AND TO THE SECRETARY OF STATE:
- 6 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 7 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 8 represent and petition as follows:
- 9 WHEREAS, The strait of Juan de Fuca is an international waterway
- 10 and represents an international resource; and
- 11 WHEREAS, This resource is threatened by the dumping of raw sewage
- 12 carrying toxic chemicals and heavy metals; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Victoria, British Columbia, maintains a waste management
- 14 policy that permits the dumping of raw sewage into the strait from
- 15 municipalities totaling two hundred thirty thousand residents; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Washington cities south of the border are implementing
- 17 secondary sewage treatment systems costing millions of dollars; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Secondary treatment makes good ecological sense and helps
- 2 to ensure good public health; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The international joint commission operating under the
- 4 boundary waters treaty of 1909, advises Canada and the United States on
- 5 boundary water disputes;
- 6 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the United
- 7 States state department make an appeal to the department of external
- 8 affairs of Canada to join in a cooperative effort to protect the strait
- 9 of Juan de Fuca, and to begin the necessary steps to cease the dumping
- 10 of raw sewage into the strait. We further call on the state department
- 11 to request the international joint commission investigate the problem
- 12 in accordance with the boundary waters treaty.
- BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 14 transmitted to the Honorable George Bush, President of the United
- 15 States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the
- 16 House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of
- 17 Washington.
